Lent - The Practices that Transform Us

For forty days, we prepare for Easter through inner reflection and spiritual practices that encourage humility, generosity, and community. This year we are encouraging our entire community to engage our St. Peter's Discipleship Covenant in a refreshed way. The Covenant models for us what Christian life is all about. This Lent, engage in as many of these five effective principles as possible.

- 1) Worship Commit to engaging in a service each week of Lent, and our services during Holy Week.
- 2) Prayer & Study Join our Bible Study and our Wednesday Healing & Anointing Services.
- 3) Active Involvement Connect with an outreach initiative or serve on a Sunday morning.
- 4) Financial Contribution Increase your financial commitment to the ministry of St. Peter's.
- 5) **Evangelism -** Bring a friend to church.

A Lenten Word from Rev. Sister Mary: Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March the 6 this year. In the Book of Alternative Services page 281 it says" We begin this holy season by remembering our need for repentance, for the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel of Jesus Christ." And, "we begin our journey to Easter with the sign of ashes, an ancient sign" of repentance and a call to remember that human is a composition of earthy substance and to "dust you shall return." Come and join us in our Lenten journey next four Sundays which leads us to Holy Week and the great celebration of Easter Sunday. The Book of Common Prayer two services on Ash Wednesday are at 10.30 a.m. and at 7.00 p.m. with the imposition of ashes and anointing of sacred oil for healing. St. Peter's Anglican Church provides numerous opportunities for the parishioners and members of the community to worship.


We have two weekly Sunday services:
