

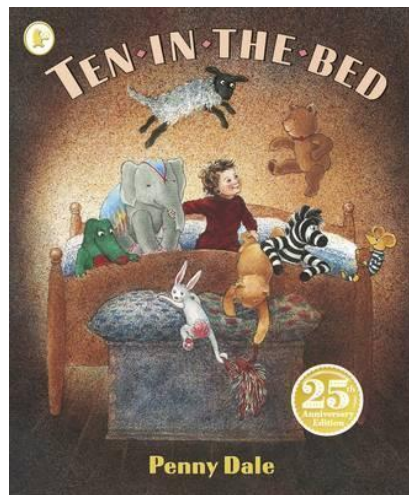

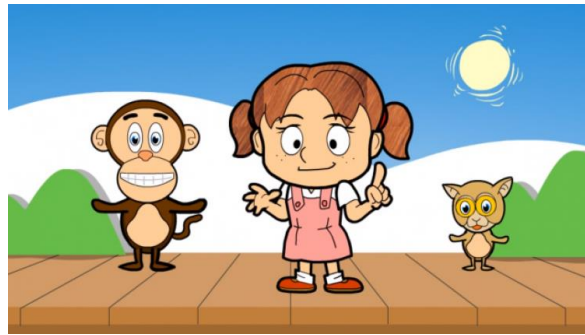

This activity provides a good model for learners starting to write letters and numbers.

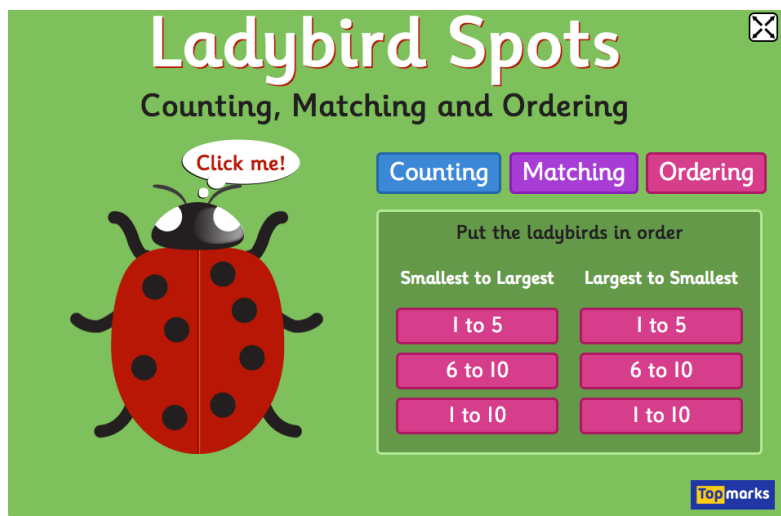

Other Ideas

Use pens/pencils/crayons/chalk/paint brushes and any other writing utensils and let the children make marks on paper (or chalk on the ground outside).

Play Dough - great for rolling, squashing and moulding

Jigsaws/inset puzzles - use for matching skills, also great for speech development, e.g. can you find the car/duck? (give a choice of 2 pieces)

Getting Dressed - sing 'This is the way we put on our...' name each item as the child gets dressed and if they are able, say the item (jumper) and let them pick the jumper.

Head, shoulders, knees and toes - sing with the children and encourage them to point at the body parts

Counting - count items with the children e.g. 5 cars and let them point to the car as you count or if able let them count by themselves. Keep them motivated and ask for a number of the items e.g. give me 3 cars (make it harder, give me 2 red cars)

Lots of stories, songs and nursery rhymes especially action songs where the children can join in. Some of our favourites in Class One are: Roly Poly, Wind the Bobbin up, The Grand Old Duke, The big ship sails, The Pirate Song (When I was one...).

I am really missing all of the children in Class One and I hope all the children are keeping well. I will keep posting ideas on here and on the school Facebook page.
