## **Update for Service Projects**

On August 17, we delivered 13 baby quilts and 75 fabric hearts to Riverside Hospital. The ladies were very excited to receive them.

You may continue to support Small Service Projects in the following ways:

- Small baby quilts for families are in need at Riverside Hospital and comfort quilts for babies in CHKD NICU palliative care. A good size for these quilts is approximately 30" x 36".
- Fabric hearts for mothers with babies in NICU at Riverside and CHKD are also needed.
- Full-size pillowcases made with bright, happy novelty fabric for children with cancer at MCV in Richmond should be made with 100% cotton fabric. Please don't use fabric with glitter or flannel. Finished pillowcases will be taken to the Blue Crab Quilt, Co., in Richmon for

distribution at MCV Hospital. They are rewashed and pressed by the hospital liaison so there is no need to wash and press them.



When you sign up for the *Where Ya' Been* workshop, you will need to know which stamps you want to purchase. These will be ordered ahead of time so you will have them to pick your background fabric and have them before the workshop. They will offer buy three mini stamps at \$6 each and you get one free. This is the same offer they had at their booth at Mid Atlantic if you visited them.
