

THE LAKE

The lake was one of the earliest resources of the community. Prior to the 1800's, it was a life source for migrating Native Americans who would fish the lake and hunt the hills beyond. For early settlers, the Lily Lake and Ferson Creek served as a food source, water source, and energy source for the saw mill on Hanson Road. Today what was once a 12 acre lake is now a pond and wetland, throughout the year wildlife is abundant. The area known as Lily Lake serves as a major recharge area that contributes to the aquifers serving Lily Lake and Campton Township. Environmental sensitivity of the lake and its associated watershed is well recognized.
