Honor Quilts

All I can say is WOW! Many, many thanks to all of the wonderful ladies who showed up and worked so diligently at our workshop on January 28th. We had a total number of 24 who cut, ironed, and sewed quilt tops and pillowcases. I was told by multiple ladies that the entire day was a lot of fun. From this workshop I believe we will end up with at least 10 quilts. Bonita made 7 pillow cases to hold them; then, went home and made 19 more with a friend's help. A special thank you goes to Gala Damato, who made multiple door prizes. I am planning to have another workshop at the end of March, so look for more information on that.

CORRECTION: on the pattern I handed out at the workshop the final line had an error. For the four corners of the quilt, it should read: Cut two 5 1/8" squares, then cut each square in half on the diagonal ONE TIME to make the four corners. I apologize for any confusion.

In addition to working on quilts at the workshop, the Busy Bee Stitchers Bee delivered 27 Honor Quilts to Veterans at the Hampton VA Convalescent Center on February 11. We delivered several in the activity room and then went from room to room handing out quilts personally to residents. Two recipients were ladies. Everyone who received a quilt was very appreciative, thanking us multiple times, and some of them in tears. They shared some of their stories of service, one who served in three wars. They were so touched that someone would spend so much time on a quilt for them. It was a very rewarding experience for us all.

My thanks again to the dedicated long arm

quilters who turn our pieced tops into quilts. We couldn't do it without you.



- Challenge 2016 Quilts—Gretchen Martin announced that the title is "Borders Galore". Janet Dyer and Kendra Palmer are also on the committee. The quilt should be 34"x50" and should have 1 block of any size, in any location. There should be 3 or more borders and a binding. All choices of color, pattern, and fabric are up to the individual. The backing must contain all of the fabrics from the front. There shouldn't be any embellishment but needle and thread. No kits can be used. Include a 4" sleeve, label, and artist's statement. Sign up at Gretchen's table and get a piece of chocolate! The quilts will be shown and judged at the October, 2016 meeting. Qualifying quilts will go in the 2017 Mid-Atlantic Quilt Festival. 2016 Challenge Changes

Not having done/participated in a challenge before, Gretchen and I are re-inventing the wheel as we go with the 2016 PPQG Challenge.

We received lot of comments and would like to amend the Challenge rules: 1.) The finished quilt size should be 34" to 36" wide and 49" to 51" long. This gives quilters some latitude and we don't have to find a U.S. Bureau of Standards tape measure. 2.) September 13, the night chapter quilt meeting, will be the West. Brenda is a long-time member of PPQG and also of the 54-40 Quilt Guild. The 54-40 is a guild of African American Quilters. Brenda explained that "54-40" is the name of a quilt block that represents the 54-40 parallel where slaves crossed from the United States into Canada. Brenda briefly gave the history of African American quilters, who started during slavery. Then she introduced other members of both guilds: Aretha Henderson, Goldie Fields, and Sandra Combs. Brenda and Aretha showed quilts from all of the women, explaining how they use traditional African-style fabrics in their guilts. Brenda also mentioned that she had not done much with guilting until she went to a Guild Symposium and met Sandy Curran. Then the two started quilting. The presentation received a rousing round of applause from the audience.

- **Monthly Mini Winner**—Barbara Linde, Kitty Tully, and Brenda Smith won the sweatshirts. The Guild made \$33.00.
- Show and Tell—Seven members showed their quilts.
- Door Prizes—Jeanne Surber drew the door prizes.
- **Adjourn**—Jeanne Surber adjourned the meeting at 8:45 P. M.




PPQG DAY CHAPTER: BLOCK OF THE MONTH for FEBRUARY 2016 ... BORN UNDER A WANDERING STAR* 12" (finished), 12½" raw edge size


Your kit should contain: ONE 4¹/₂" square of navy/lavender print, ONE 3¹/₂" square of lavender, EIGHT 2¹/₂" squares of turquoise, EIGHT 2" squares of dark blue, TWO 4¹/₂"x6¹/₂" rectangles of white, FOUR 2x3¹/₂" rectangles of white, FOUR 2" squares of white, FOUR 4¹/₂"x2¹/₂" rectangles of white and THREE 2¹/₂" squares of white PLEASE STRIVE VERY HARD FOR AN ACCURATE 1/4" SEAM ALLOWANCE ... If you find you are having difficulty getting the 1/4" seam, **www.learnhowtoquilt.com** has good videos, as both a refresher and some good tips. We all know how frustrating it can be to have a block not come out the way you had hoped! MEASURE YOUR BLOCK WHEN IT IS DONE TO BE SURE IT IS 12¹/₂" (unfinished) !!!


YOUR FINISHED STAR POINTS SHOULD BE 1/4" FROM THE EDGE OF THE BLOCK!

- Make the "flying geese" units for the small star. On the wrong side of the eight dark blue squares, draw a diagonal line. Align a square with the left side of a 2x3½" rectangle of white, right sides together, as shown in A to the right. Stitch on the line. Press toward dark (B). Trim off waste triangles below. Now add a second square, align with the right side (C). Stitch, press toward dark (D). Trim waste triangles below. MAKE 4 OF THESE! Your point should be ¼" from the edge of the unit.
- 2. Make the "flying geese" units for the large star. On the wrong side of the eight turquoise squares, draw a diagonal line. Follow the directions in step 1, except use the turquoise and the $2\frac{1}{2}x4\frac{1}{2}$ " white rectangles. MAKE 4 OF THESE!
- 3. Assemble the upper left quadrant (small star). Using the 2x2" white squares, the dark blue/white flying geese and the lavender 3½x3½" square, stitch the three rows of the star. Press as shown by the arrows. Then stitch the rows together. IF YOU PLACE THE FLYING GEESE UNITS ON TOP AS YOU STITCH, YOU WILL BE ABLE TO SEE THE EXACT INTERSECTION OF THE POINT AND STITCH EXACTLY THROUGH THAT.
- Make the upper right quadrant of the block. Stitch a 2½x2½" white square to the RIGHT of a turquoise flying geese unit. Press toward square. Now join this unit to the bottom of one of the 4½x6½" white rectangles. Press toward rectangle.
- 5. Make the lower left quadrant of the block. Stitch a $2\frac{1}{2}x2\frac{1}{2}$ " white square to the LEFT of a turquoise flying geese unit. Press toward square. Now join this unit to the side of one of the $4\frac{1}{2}x6\frac{1}{2}$ " white rectangles, as shown. Press toward rectangle.
- Make the lower right quadrant of the block. Stitch the remaining 2½x2½" white to the right of a flying geese unit. Stitch another geese unit to the right of the large print square. Press following arrows. Stitch these two units together.
- 7. Assemble block using these four quadrants. At the far right, I have taken the finished block diagram and overlaid dark lines to help you visualize the four quadrants.










Take a close look at that white fabric to tell right side from wrong side!
