In my teenage years, there were so many questions about what I was going to do with my life. So many questions that needed to get figured out, or lived into... What was my life going to be about? What was I going to do for a job? What might I study? Where might I go to school? Who were going to be my friends? Where was I going to live? Who was I going to marry? So many questions, it was almost overwhelming.

And of course, it's still the same way. Young kids are still figuring it all out. And I wonder if their choices are the same as when I was young, or if they are more complicated. I really don't know. But at any rate, we always need to give our kids a lot of space and love and encouragement. And they will indeed live into these questions and figure things out. We all did, and they will too.

It also seems that the older I get, the more I pray for kids. I pray for my kids, and the church kids, and it's joyful to watch them grow up. I'm always amazed, as it says in the song, *Borning Cry*, to see their lives unfold.

My prayer as we enter another year, is that it will be full of meaning and love. And may our kids be blessed and may we all be blessed by the years and life we share together...




