Searcy County





The Searcy County School District currently has four campuses and is the largest employer in the area. The four campuses include Marshall High School, Leslie Intermediate, Marshall Elementary, and the North Central Career Center. District-wide, our enrollment is 830 students. Our ABC Preschool has an enrollment of 57 students.

Students of the Searcy County School District are surrounded by dedicated, caring, highly qualified professionals whose goal is to help all students be successful. We employ three academic instructional facilitators to work with teachers and students in the areas of literacy and mathematics. Through the efforts of our staff, the percentage of students performing at proficient or advanced levels consistently trends in a positive direction.

Current trend data from referenced tests over the past four years show consistent growth in student performance at all grade levels in both literacy and math. As a result, in 2016, Marshall High School was ranked as the No. 2 Best High School in Arkansas by schooldigger.com. Both Marshall High School and Leslie Intermediate Schools received monetary awards from the Arkansas Recognition and Reward Program of Act 854 of 2015, which recognized schools with high student performance and student growth; Marshall High received awards in 2015 and 2016, Leslie Intermediate in 2016. District schools have earned several awards from the Office of Educational Policy (OEP), including "Beating the Odds – High Achieving Schools Serving Low-Income Communities." In 2016, Marshall Elementary earned the Beating the Odds award for third grade math. In 2014, Marshall High was named a Top 10% School and received an Arkansas School Recognition award from the Arkansas Department of Education. In 2017 and 2018, Marshall High School was listed as a Bronze School by U.S. News and World Report as a result of consistently high test scores on our end-of-course exams, making it the fourth year in a row MHS has received this proud distinction.

In September, 2014, with over \$7,000,000 for construction and renovation projects, we were able to provide a new heat and air system at Leslie Intermediate; complete four new classrooms, handicapped-accessible sidewalks, and renovations to the Ray Moore Gym lobby and restrooms at Marshall High School; and constructed twelve new classrooms with a safe area at Marshall Elementary.

This year, Marshall High School will celebrate its 95rd Class Reunion.

Silver Hill—Gilbert Area

The 6 miles of highway (US 65 & AR 333) that crosses the Buffalo National River can take days to travel if you see and do everything. This area is

complete with river outfitters,



restaurants, cabins, canoes to rent. Be sure and visit the <u>Tyler Bend Visitor Center</u> on the <u>Buffalo National River</u> at Silver Hill. The center details the story of America's First National River. Here you will find exhibits on recreation, the establishment of the park, prehistoric and pioneer histo-

ry, flora, fauna and hiking. There are great campsites here as well to rent.

St. Joe-Pindall

Forest products, underground wonders, pastoral scenery, and smiling Buffalo River floaters can all be found coexisting in the rolling hills of northern Searcy County. Visitors can tour the St. Joe Depot Museum in St. Joe, and get delicious smoked meats and cheeses at Big Springs Trading Company. Pindall also hosts the only church furniture manufacturer in the state of Arkansas! They also produce furniture for courtrooms and funeral homes.



Snowball—Witts Spring — Richland Valley

Searcy County's Wild West offers rugged mountains, waterfalls, and a wilderness environment. There is some spectacular scenery in this area, including Point Peter, Falling Water Creek, and the "Ozark Highlands Trail" along Richland Creek. There are herds of Elk in this area so be sure and bring your camera. You can camp or picnic at Richland Creek Campground or the Ozark National Forest. Check out Hillbilly Daze in Witts Spring on May 25th!!





America's First National River

Established in 1972, Buffalo National River flows freely for 135 miles and is one of the few remaining undammed rivers in the lower 48 states. The Buffalo has been designated a Blue Ribbon Smallmouth Bass Stream. Once you arrive, prepare to journey from running rapids to quiet pools while surrounded by massive bluffs as you cruise through the Ozark Mountains down to the White River.

With four Wildlife Management Areas, two Nationals Forests and the Buffalo National River, Searcy County offers thousands of wooded acres for your next hunt. Whitetail deer are the prime target for large game hunters, but in 2015 the Ar-

kansas Game & Fish Commission (AGFC) ranked Searcy County as the #1 place to hunt black bear in all of the Ozarks.

Got your eye on an elk? **We are the Elk Hunting Capital of Arkansas**: 54 of the 67
elk harvested in 2018 came from Searcy
County.The elk population is managed, so
be sure to check the Arkansas Game & Fish





Wild turkey, rabbit, squirrel, bobwhite quail, dove and various furbearers, coyote and even wild hogs roam the county. Of all the varieties of fish swimming in our rivers and creeks, smallmouth bass, catfish and sunfish are the most popular. You might even catch the occasional trout making their way up the Buffalo.

Motorcycle Riding



Searcy County is definitely Motorcycle Friendly!!!

Thousands of riders every year make the trek up U.S. Highway 65 to view the beautiful north central Arkansas Ozarks. If you would like to take some scenic, back road "detours", there are a couple routes you should try.

These two routes are almost entirely within Searcy County and both have some great scenery and some nice challenging curves.

The Bear Creek Growl begins on State Highway 27 outside the Searcy County Courthouse, constructed in the 1880s and site of the Searcy County Veterans Memorial and the Veterans Wall of Honor. The route turns left on to US 65, and will pass Kenda Drive-In, the only year-round drive-in movie theater in the entire state. Leaving Marshall, the rider will see one of Arkansas' most panoramic views as they look west toward Point Peter Mountain. Descending into the lush farmlands of the Bear Creek valley, the rider might just see some elk. The route turns left at State Highway 74, and crosses Bear Creek.


The route leads to the town of Snowball, where Ozark folk music legend Jimmy Driftwood was once the school's principal. Snowball the gateway to the Richland Valley and the Ozark Highland Trail, and is also one of the horseback trailheads for the unforgettable annual Falling Water Trail Ride. West of Snowball is the county's highest point of elevation, Horn Mountain, at 2,203 feet above sea level.

From Snowball, the rider continues the journey on State Highway 377, transiting just east of the Ozark National Forest to Witts Springs. Witts Springs is home of the annual Hillbilly Daze and the Pedestal Rock 40. At Witts Springs, the traveler turns left onto State Highway 16, then takes another turn left onto State Highway 27 at the town of Tilly.

Here the Bear Creek Growl ventures briefly into Pope and Van Buren Counties. Once over the headwaters of Bear Creek, the route veers north into Searcy County once more. The rider will pass Reves Knob and the Middle Fork of the Little Red River to the west before reaching the communities of Welcome Home and Bohannon.

The route ends back in Marshall as it passes the old, historic county jail just before arriving again at the Courthouse. The Bear Creek Growl is a 57 mile round trip loop. <u>Mileage Courtesy of MHS East Club</u>

The Leslie Lasso begins in Searcy County on State Highway 66, in the quaint Ozark Mountain town of Leslie. Leslie is home to shops, multiple parks, restaurants, and a wood-fired brick oven bakery that produces old-world sourdough bread.

Travelling east from Leslie involves tackling a mountainous, 11 percent grade. After passing through Oxley, the route descends into Stone County. At the community of Timbo, the route takes a left on State Highway 263. Shortly after this turn, the route passes the old home of Grammy Award winning folk singer Jimmy Driftwood on the right. The scenic drive continues through the community of Onia and just to the west of the Ozark National Forest. At the town of Big Flat, the rider will turn left onto Highway 14. Here the Leslie Lasso reenters Searcy County. The next eight miles twist and curve as they dance with the clear waters of Big Creek. In Harriet, the route follows left onto State Highway 27.

Highway 27 takes the motorcyclist to the south of the Loafer's Glory Wildlife Management Area. At the community of Morning Star, the route passes the South Maumee Road on its right, which leads to hiking, canoe access, and a primitive campground on the Buffalo National River. Proceeding through Morning Star, but before reaching Marshall, the rider will turn left onto State Highway 74. This portion offers bucolic countryside with little traffic but sweeping views of Long Creek and Big Creek. Once through the communities of Landis and Thola, the route will briefly re-enter Stone County. A right turn at Highway 66 will soon have the rider back in Searcy County and Oxley. 7 miles on, the route twists its way down an 11 percent grade and finishes back in the town of Leslie. #7 Incredible Lodging! Amazing cabins, lodges, cottages, glamping, RV campgrounds, farm stay, yurt, and teepee accommodations! Ozark Mountain and/or Buffalo River country!

The big trail ride of the year is the annual Falling Water Trail Ride during the first weekend of October. Riders begin the trail from either the Woolum Campground or Snowball Gym.

#12 Rock climbing! The Stack Rock Special Interest Area in the Ozark National Forest near Witts Springs is accessed by a 3 mile round-trip hike off of the Richland Road all the way around Stack Rock. The towering overhead bluffs are a rock climbing destination!



Campgrounds

<u>Tyler Bend</u>, on the Buffalo National River, includes 10 walk in and 28 drive in sites. The campground provides flush toilet restrooms, one with hot showers. Water spigots are located throughout the campground. A dump station and tank filler is located near the park entrance at Highway 65. No RV hookups. Open year round. For pricing and reservations, go to www.recreation.gov or call 877-444-6777.

<u>Woolum camping area.</u> Open year round. Located seven miles southwest of St. Joe. Vault toilet on site. No fees charged. Horse camping is permitted. This is a pack in/pack out facility with no trash service provided.

<u>Grinders Ferry and Shine Eye</u> Both offer easily-accessible but primitive camping right on the Buffalo River. Vault toilet open year round. No trash services will be provided. No fees charged.



<u>South Maumee</u> Open year round. Located 7 miles off Hwy 27 north of the community of Morning Star. Five campsites, each with a picnic table, fire ring and lantern hook. Vault toilet on site. No trash services will be provided. No fees.

<u>Spring Creek Campground</u> has 12 designated sites with tables, fire rings, and lantern hooks at each site. The

campground has a vault toilet. No water available. No fees charged. Open year round. No RV's allowed.

<u>Buffalo Camping & Canoeing in Gilbert</u> has primitive campgrounds 3/4 a mile from the Buffalo River. They have RV and tent sites, with shower house and restrooms, but no dump station. May require a float reservation before booking campground.

<u>Gilbert RV Campground</u> RV section has 18 grass and gravel lots. 20, 30, and 50 amp electric hookups. The tent section of the campground offers eight tent sites, including "glamping".

Richland Creek Campground has a small picturesque mountain stream with waterfalls, rocks, and bluffs. There is access to the Richland Creek Wilderness Area. 11 family camping units. Because of very rough roads, camping trailers are not encouraged.

Ozark Grinder Trail

The Ozark Grinder Trail is approximately 129 miles, predominately of gravel, and 9,000 feet+ of elevation gained from Tyler Bend at the Buffalo National River to Fairfield Bay! More miles of gravel connect to the main route: the Lick Fork Connector, the Marshall Spur, the Leslie Loop, the Oxley Loop, and the Meadowcreek Loop!



The route offers fabulous views of the Buffalo National River, Richland Creek, Falling Water Creek, and the Middle Fork of the Little Red River.



Ride along the Ozark Highlands Trail, the Buffalo River Trail, and along stretches of the long-departed Missouri & North Arkansas Railroad. This trail sports serious mountain climbs and steep descents! High water at low bridge crossings may make the trail impassable at times. Do not attempt dangerous water crossings. Turn around, don't drown. This remote route is often without cellphone service. Ride with a partner and plan ahead for this incredible adventure.



ock Climbing - Stack Rock

Searcy County has great rock climbing. Stack Rock, in the Richland Valley area is in the Ozark National Forest of Searcy County! It's about a 3 mile, moderately strenuous hike, where you hike all the way around Stack Rock with bluffs towering over your head the entire way.

It is also a great rock climbing destination! It is Arkansas' largest continuous



crag—a 360-degree rock with routes on every face that's argued by some as Arkansas' most scenic rock-climbing setting thanks to an expansive view of the vallev below. Most of the climbing here is advanced traditional, meaning you are placing protection as you go up. If you're not quite as experienced, Stack Rock also offers some moderate sport and trad pitches to hone your skills.



Cresting Backbone Mountain iust south of Marshall at the roadside park, and again leaving Marshall heading north on US Highway 65, the motorist will see one of Arkansas' panoramic most views looking west towards Point Peter Mountain that stands prominent at 2.040 feet above sea level.

West of Snowball is Searcy County's highest elevation, Horn Mountain, which soars to 2,203 feet above sea level.

State Highway 27 transits just to the west of 2,032 foot high Reves Knob and the Middle Fork of the Little Red River.

Up, down, and around go our roads traversing river bottoms, running along ridge lines, and descending into hollows. This is a rough but beautiful land that is home to old pioneer families and newcomers alike. (The 11% Grade photo is State Highway 66 before descending to the town of Leslie).




Stem Rock and Geocaching



Stem Rock Natural Area has a beautiful natural rock formation near Oxlev! The 3/4 mile trail from the parking area to the rock formation is mostly level. Searcy County's Famous

Searcy County's heritage is rich in art and music. Many Searcy County natives have gone on to lasting national recognition.

Absie and Abbie Morrison were twin brothers, born and raised in the Searcy County community of Campbell, Arkansas. Absie also won the Burl Ives award, and played at the Grand Ole Opry. Absie's fiddle is on display at the Ozark Heritage Art Center in Leslie.

Hubert Carl (Hugh) Ashley was born near Wiley's Cove and graduated from Marshall High School. He wrote songs for five members of the Country Music Hall of



Fame and at thirteen joined his father's musical group, the Ashley Melody Men, playing guitar, singing, and yodeling. The Ashley Melody Men made some of the first known recordings of Ozark folk music, with RCA Victor. Country Music Hall of Famer Jimmie Rodgers credited Ashley for helping to popularize the style of music now known as Country.

Searcy County native Elton Britt (born James Elton Baker) had the first country music performance to be awarded a gold record for selling more than a million copies with "There's a Star Spangled Banner Waving Somewhere." In addition, Britt once won the world championship as a yodeler. Britt also has a star on the "Hollywood Walk of Fame."

Jimmy Driftwood was nominated for multiple Grammy Awards and his song "The Battle of New Orleans" won a Grammy in 1960 for Song of the Year. He wrote over 6,000 songs and is a member of the Arkansas Entertainers Hall of Fame. Driftwood graduated from Marshall High School in 1928 and later worked in the Snowball School.

Another Searcy County native, Frankia Stills Treat earned gold, platinum, and double platinum albums for writing a song on Country star John Anderson's Seminole Winds album. She was also a writer for Buck Owens' Blue Book Music. Her son Mason Treat was a drummer for John Anderson's band and also earned gold, platinum, and double

platinum albums for Seminole Winds.



Essie Ann Treat Ward, often referred to as "Grandma Moses of the Ozarks," produced paintings that are fascinating examples of primitive art. In 1970, she participated in the Smithsonian Festival of American Folklife in Washington DC. Today hundreds of her paintings hang in public and private art collections around the world. Fifty-five of her paintings are now owned by the Shiloh Museum of Ozark History in Springdale. Essie was born in the community of Nubbin Hill, and attended the Caid School.


Searcy County Agriculture

Agriculture has always been and continues to be a large part of Searcy County life. Searcy County is beef cattle country! Bottom-land hay fields and cattle pastures on rolling hillsides are commonplace throughout the county. The county continues to have some dairy production as well. Small farms also produce goats and goat products, as well as hogs, turkeys, chickens, and rabbits. There are numerous horses in Searcy County, most used for horseback



riding. Ratchford Farms raises bison locally and sends 35 to 40 for processing each year. Small farms produce eggs, honey, bedding plants, garden vegetables, pumpkins and blueberries. The Ozarks are known for their black walnuts and Searcy County is a significant producer. Locals harvest wild blackberries and both tame and wild muscadine grapes. Small-scale goat-milk soap

production takes place locally. The county also has a thriving timber industry which contributes greatly to the local economy. Hardwood timber is the primary harvest that feeds several county sawmills. Pallets. pallet parts, railroad ties, lumber, landscape timbers and fencing are produced locally. So is smoker wood and charcoal. There is also retail and wholesale utensil woodworking using local hardwood, in addition to a large-scale, kiln dried hardwood lumber operation.

World-Class Hiking in Searcy County

The Ozark Highlands Trail (OHT) traverses the beautiful and rugged portion of western Searcy County to include following along the Richland Valley to the Buffalo National River. The trail has been noted as one of the top 10 long distance hiking trails in the US by the Guardian! Also noted by Outside magazine as one of the World's Seven Great Winter Backpacking Trips! Come see for yourself! Rocky Mountain Elk, Bald Eagles, and Black Bear may be seen along the journey. Contact one of our Searcy County outfitters.

The OHT begins at Lake Fort Smith State Park and runs east to the Buffalo River Trail System at Woolum. It continues down river past the Highway 65 Bridge, and all the way to the Highway 14 Bridge in Marion County, approximately 208 miles!



Still under construction, the newest section in Searcy County is a 28-mile segment which goes along the south side of the Buffalo River from Highway 65 to Highway 14. The trail runs east of Tyler Bend to Red Bluff Road and then on to the South Maumee Road to the Highway 14 Bridge. South Maumee Road to the Spring Creek Road is 5.3 miles and Spring Creek Road to The Highway 14 Bridge is 6.1 miles. Depending on the season, you can see bluff lines, waterfalls, and ice formations. Also from high vantage points along the trail, you can see the Buffalo National River far below! The Trail is 24 inches wide, very often going across steep hillsides. But the trail itself is designed to avoid any grades steeper than 10%.

Hiking is also available at the Stem Rock Natural Area near Oxley, and on the north side of the Buffalo National River, both upstream and downstream from Gilbert.

Unique Rock Formations



Visible from Highway 65, just south of Silver Hill area North of Marshall (or as a guest at Bear Creek Log Cabins), you'll find stone buttresses along the bluff. These rare and beautiful rock formations are caused

by water erosion and, according to the Arkansas Geological Survey, have been located in only two places in Arkansas.

Leslie, Arkansas

The quaint Ozark Mountain town of Leslie is a treasure all its own. Restored old buildings give Leslie a character that few American towns possess today. This town of less than 500 harkens back to a bygone era of Americana. Homesteaded by pioneers moving West from the Appalachians, Leslie was first surveyed by Herbert Hoover in the last part of the 19th century. The Missouri & North Arkansas Railroad

once came through Leslie. A railroad spur, the Dinky Line, once hauled mighty white oak timber from the hills to the world's largest barrel making factory that turned out up to 4,500 barrels a day. The railroad and barrel factory are now relegated to the pages of history, but the town still thrives.

Today Leslie is the crossroads for tourists going to and from Mountain View, the "Folk Mu-



sic Capital of the World," and travel to and from Branson, Missouri. Leslie's commercial historic district is home to antique stores, shops, multiple parks, restaurants and a wood-fired brick oven bakery that produces old-world sourdough bread. Leslie is also home to a 9-hole Disc Golf Course.

Leslie is also the live music center of Searcy County. The Ozark Heritage Arts Center is located in a building constructed in 1938 by the Works Progress Administration. The arts center seats approximately 350 people in its Killebrew Theatre, and hosts concerts, musicals and plays. The facility also presents an art gallery and a museum, which pays tribute to accomplished local musicians—some of whom have gone on to great fame! Ryan's Main Street Grill has Karaoke Thursday nights, and live music every Friday and Saturday night. Leslie is not just another cookie cutter modern American town, it's a place to slow down and soak up some of the

best of our nation's past.

Leslie has an annual "Homecoming" celebration that is very well attended every year. The 2019, Leslie's 65th annual Homecoming celebration is scheduled for June 13th through the 15th.



Trail Rides/Horse Camp

Searcy County Ozarks offer some of the finest trail riding experiences east of the Rocky Mountains, with miles of scenic trails at both private horse camps and on public lands! Horses are permitted on the Buffalo River Trail from Woolum to



Gilbert. They have to cross the river upstream of Tyler Bend as they are not permitted on the trails in the visitor center/campground area. It is about 12 1/2 miles from Woolum to HWY 65 and 3.7 miles from HWY 65 to Gilbert.

There is a large pull off/parking area along the Shine Eye Road at HWY 65 where horse trailers can be parked for day trail

rides. Horse camping is permitted at Woolum. The camping is on the north side of the river and the trail is on the south side so its important to make note of river levels. The railroad trail downstream out of Gilbert is also a horse trail. This is a level trail along the old railroad bed for 2.4 miles one way. There is a hiking trail from HWY 65 to Gilbert of 3.7 miles. In addition, downstream out of Gilbert, a level trail travels along the Missouri and North Arkansas railroad bed for 2.4 miles. ilbert, "The Coolest Town in Arkansas"

Not only is Gilbert the "Coolest Town" in Arkansas, often with the lowest recorded temperatures in the state, but it's also Arkansas' smallest incorporated town. The



short drive along Highway 333 is simply beautiful. When you arrive, you'll find a town that time forgot. Welcome to the quiet community, surrounded by the cool mist of the Buffalo River. Gilbert is the smallest sister city in the world. Her sister city, Bride, is on the isle of Man in the Irish Sea

"Population 33" reads the sign as you come into town. The historic cemetery contains more headstones than people

currently living in Gilbert, but don't let the size fool you. Gilbert may be a tiny town, but it's big on beauty and charm. It's location can't be beat: nestled on the banks of the Buffalo National River in the Ozark Mountains

The main road in town offers access to the river, which is noted for its beautiful limestone bluffs, smallmouth bass, and year-round floating. Canoe rental and shuttle service is available.

The Gilbert General Store, built in 1901, is listed on the National Register of Historic Places under the name Mays Store. The community was founded in 1902, when the Missouri & North Arknasas Railroad was built. Gilbert was a hub for commerce. Cotton, logs, ore and grain came by rail. The railroad tracks were removed and sold as scrap, after the railroad ceased operation in 1946, but there are still signs of where the old tracks lay. The former rail bed is now a hiking route along the river.

Today, Gilbert contains homes, guest houses, cabin rentals, a fabulous RV park, and camping facilities. The Gilbert General Store is still in operation, a short walk from the river, providing supplies, and hunting and fishing licenses. Check out the snack bar at the Gravel Bar Pavilion. Gilbert welcomes visitors to stay a day, a week, or even a lifetime! Remember: You may leave Gilbert, but Gilbert will never leave you!



The Kenda Drive-In in Marshall is one of the Natural State's treasures and celebrated its 50th anniversary in 2016!

The Kenda is Arkansas' only drive-in movie theater that is open year round, and one of only three drive-in's left in the entire state! Locals can still be heard talking about "going to the show." The "show" is what's playing at the Kenda! For flatlanders and



mountain folk alike, the Kenda means friends, family, food, and lots of fun!

Of course the favorite way to watch a movie at the Kenda is from the back of your truck sitting in a lawn chair, all wrapped up in a blanket. The 72 foot wide screen is lit up with a first run feature each night. Movie audio is provided by either digital FM radio sound or traditional speakers, and heaters are even provided for winter viewing. And talk about affordable! Where else can you take the family out these days and not break the bank? Kenda's regular admission price is six dollars for adults, with children under 12 free with parents. A two dollar admission applies for ages 6-11 for kid's movies. 
