James Karam is President and founder of First Bristol Corporation and provides the leadership and direction of this 35 year old regional Real Estate Development and Management Company. Originally founded in 1975, First Bristol Corporation's focus has been the development of quality retail shopping centers, first-class office buildings, and hotels throughout Southern New England. Mr. Karam's commitment to excellence is evidenced by the successful nature of the company's varied developments and his recognition for being in the forefront of this ever-changing industry. He also is co-owner of WSAR and WHTB radio stations, serving the Massachusetts Southcoast region.

Mr. Karam's current and past professional and civic affiliations are extensive. He has devoted many hours in civic and charitable organizations, including as the Chairman of the Board of Governors of the largest community health care system in New England, Caritas Christi Health Care System, and as the former Chairman and Vice Chair of the Board of Trustees for the University of Massachusetts five (5) campus system, Co-Chairman of the Southcoast CEO Group and Southcoast Economic Development partnership. He also serves on the Board of Directors of Steward Health Care System, a for-profit portfolio company of Cerberus Capital Management.

In the area of commercial development, First Bristol Corporation has developed in excess of 3,000,000 square feet of shopping centers, hotels, and office buildings throughout Massachusetts, Rhode Island, and New Hampshire, including Wal-Mart, Shaw's, Stop & Shop, and CVS anchored shopping centers. First Bristol has also been a leading provider of first class office buildings in Mass and R.I. and five (5) hotels located in Providence, RI; Norwood, Mass; Raynham, Mass; and Newport/Middletown, R.I.. DURFEE BELLS ARE COMING HOME!



Late this summer the Durfee bells will be installed in the new Durfee bell tower on Elsbree Street. It has been nearly 10 years since the bells were shipped off to the Meeks Watson bell foundry in Georgetown, Ohio to be refurbished and tuned.

Since the publication of the last edition of the Chimes, a lot has been accomplished. Construction details were finally completed and the last of the engineering approvals was obtained in June of 2010. On July 21, we rejoiced as the first shovelful of dirt was turned and a massive 10 foot deep, 20 by 20 foot hole was dug for the tower foundation near the entrance to the Durfee High School sports complex. Over the following 3 weeks, forms were built and the hole was filled with over 100 tons of crushed stone and 50 cubic yards of concrete. The anchors to hold the tower in place were embedded in the concrete and in late August, galvanized steel was trucked in and construction of the tower began in earnest. Members of the Durfee Bells Preservation Society were on hand to witness every beam being raised in place as the main portion of the tower rose to its full height of 52 feet. On top of the tower, the 8-ringed, open frame steeple was hauled into place by an 80 foot crane on September 9th.

The “topping off” ceremony was attended by about 50 Durfee alums and friends who applauded the installation of the finial – the final piece at the very top of the tower that brought the finished height to 77 feet above the surrounding Durfee campus. Those who have been to the top can attest to the magnificence of the view from that dizzying height.

Painting of the structure was done in colors selected by the architect, John Lusk of Bristol RI and then, on a bright, chilly but mostly windless November day, the 4 majestic, 8 foot diameter clocks were installed. The clocks were a gift from the Robert Curry family and Rev Shirley Andrews in loving memory of Janice Curry who, together with Dr. Ira Rex, Paul Vaites and a few others began the project to restore and re-hang the Durfee Bells more than a decade ago. The onset of winter brought work at the tower site to a temporary close.

In March, Bell Master Rick Watson, came to Fall River from Ohio to take final measurements for the chime frame that his company is fabricating to support the nearly 10 tons of bells that will make up the Durfee chime.

There were 10 bells in the original Durfee chime. One was stolen while the bells were in storage and a new bell has been cast to replace it. The stolen bell has yet to be recovered. About 1910 – 25 years after the Durfee bells were made, the Meneely Bell Foundry began marketing what Mr. Meneely called a “Star Spangled Banner Chime.” It consisted of 14 bells. Our new chime frame and all the associated bell playing apparatus is being designed to support 14 bells. The committee hopes that donors will come forward to help procure the four additional bells that are needed to complete the 14 bell chime. The smallest of the new bells is valued at \$6,700 and the biggest will cost \$22,900. The name of a donor and a brief message or saying can be cast into the metal of any of the new bells.

Once the chime frame is completed – probably in July, it will become an integral part of the tower and the bells will be brought home and installed. Landscaping and the laying of the engraved brick Pathway of Memories will be held off until the bells are installed so that the heavy equipment used in the bell installation will not damage the new walkway. This will allow an additional opportunity for those who want to purchase memorial bricks to do so probably through the end of June.

There are still parts of the project that remain to be accomplished but all of the money raised to date will have been spent once the bells are in place and the landscape work is finished.

The following is yet to be done. Estimated costs are in parentheses.

1. The area around the clocks needs to be enclosed. (\$24,000)
2. Bird screening needs to be installed around the bells. (\$5,000)
3. The bottom level must be enclosed to protect the ringing equipment. (\$28,000)
4. Ringing equipment needs to be designed, built and installed to enable manual ringing of the bells. (\$32,000)

The historic bells were a gift to the city of Fall River from Mary Brayton Durfee Young in honor of her son, Bradford Mathew Chaloner Durfee. The bells hung for more than 100 years in the steeple of the old Durfee High School building on Rock Street. Several traditions were instituted in those years including the tradition that the big tenor bell was rung 29 times – once for each year of the life of B.M.C. Durfee’s life – at 8:10 AM each school day. There are several stories as to how that tradition was begun but it can be said with certainty that there was no such condition imposed by Bradford Durfee’s mother in her deed of gift. The daily ringing of the bell was most likely simply a “wake up call” that the school day was about to begin and students were expected to be in their home rooms within the next 5 minutes. However that tradition began, none of the students who attended the “old” Durfee will forget it and no student now at Durfee has ever experienced it.

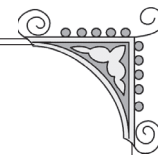

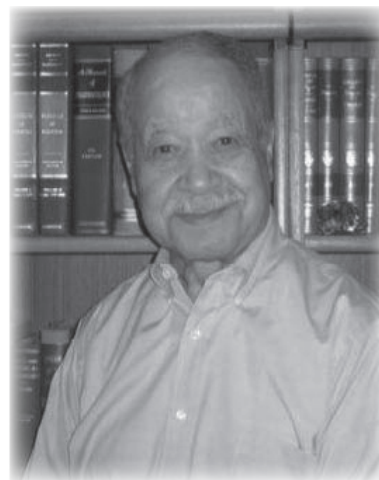

THE KERR MILL BOYS OF WORLD WAR II

The American Thread Company, perhaps better known as the Kerr Mill complex of three large buildings along Martine Street was one of the largest employers in the State with some 1,800 employees before World War II broke out and approximately 565 of them joined the Military effort on behalf of the grateful Nation which saw 20 of the “Kerr Mill Boys” paying for freedom with their lives.

Shortly after the War’s end, the management of the American Thread Co. had a large granite monument placed in front the original building on Martine Street on September 20, 1948 and the story printed in the Fall River Herald News the following day. Time passed and in 1966, the monument was moved to Eastern Avenue and Jepson Street with the assistance of the five Gold Star Mothers in attendance and the War Veterans Council as the monument had fallen into disrepair. In total the monument has stood in those two sites until the War Veterans Council felt it was “lost” in the area where Route 6 used to be a regular route from Fall River to Westport at the Narrows and requested of the City the approval to move it to its new and final site, just a few yards from its original place on Martine St., at the bend of the road at Brayton Avenue and Eastern Avenue alongside the South Watuppa Pond flanked by a donated flag pole and work done by the City. The photo is at the end of this story.

I believe this was the second monument dedicated to the War Dead of World War II, the first Fall River casualty being Staff Sgt. James T. Griffin who was Killed in Action in Germany. His monument is at the corners of Fourth, Fifth and Branch Streets in the Corky Row Section with the playground named in his honor.

The Fall River Public Library was very well equipped with data from the Fall River Herald News regarding the additional data other than the names of the deceased veterans and find that they are a remarkable place to research almost any veteran of any war.

The original work place of the “Kerr Mill Boys” no longer stands since January of 1987 when a major fire destroyed the three buildings which once stood along the South Watuppa Pond which became a large discount store much like Arlan’s on Rodman Street, which suffered the same fate.
