With the slate of nominated officers names being read by Commander Steve Bergadine, the nominations were open again for the last time. Being no more nominees, and no nominee for Sgt at Arms, he closed the nominations for the final time. With the Service Officer nominee Bud Bessey being absent and no proxy authorization in written form accepting the nomination, a point of order by Historian Kirk Conner said that the name

## **Oregon Woman Veteran of the Year**

Dodie Blessing was among three women to be given the 2016 Outstanding Oregon Women Veterans Award. The award recognizes women veterans who exemplify service as a veteran and as an outstanding member of the Oregon community, highlighting achievements in support of veterans, her commitment to

women veterans' issues and as a citizen in service of her hometown, the State of Oregon and the United States of America.

Ensign Dodie Blessing served as a nurse in the U.S. Navy Reserves from 1960-1962. She began working at the Community Cancer Center in Roseburg in 1980 and later worked in nursing at the VA Roseburg Healthcare System. There she began working with women veterans, primarily those who were inpatient, to ensure quality care. That led to her being appointed as the Women Veterans Coordinator for the local VA. Her work advocating for expanded funding and coordinating specialty care, eligibility and transportation, led to greatly expanded services for women veterans at a time when many considered them highly invisible and underserved within the VA system. Blessing is also credited with bringing other women veterans who worked for the VA system into the light where their ongoing service could be recognized.

In 1985 Dodie Blessing founded the American Women Veterans Association and was instrumental in making it part of the fabric of veterans organizations in Douglas County. Her work continued after

her retirement in 2000. She served on the Veterans Advisory Board for the Roseburg VA Hospital

where she worked to expand the awareness of women veterans.

Dodie is a past President of the Douglas County Veterans Forum, and was instrumental in the Campaign to 'Save the Roseburg VA Hospital" in 2008. For years she has served on the Douglas County Veteran Day pa-

rade Committee , helping plan and organize "Oregon's Greatest Veterans Day Parade".

Dodie who recently relocated to Coquille, is a member of Post 16 and married to Dick, a retired US Navy Veteran.

# 50th Commemoration of the Vietnam War

#### **Local Ceremony attracts 500 Vietnam Era Veterans**

On Monday March 28th, Post Commander Rick Sciapiti was the keynote speaker at the 50th Commemoration of the Vietnam War ceremony.

US Army Specialist 5 Sciapiti served in Vietnam as a Crew Chief and Door gunner on a UH-1 Huey Helicopter with the 114th Assault Helicopter Co. He spoke about the number of people who served in the military during the Vietnam Era in all job classifications, and thanked all who put on the uniform of the United States Military during an extraordinary time in our nation's history.

The commemoration recognized all Veterans who served between NOV 1, 1955 and MAY 15, 1975 regardless of duty station, branch of service, or length of time.

The local ceremony was part of over 9,000 ceremony's taking place around the country.

During the Vietnam War 12,000 US Army Helicopters saw action, with nearly 5,000 Army pilots and crew losses.

The US Navy lost 859 aircraft, with losses of flight personnel around 450. 179 US Navy flyers were taken POW.

The US Marines lost 193 Fixed and 270 Rotary winged aircraft. 95 F-4 Phantom's were lost.

The US Air Force lost 1,737 aircraft to hostile action. 382 F-4's, 31 B-52's, 55 C-130's, and 53 C-123's.

There are still 1,666 unaccounted MIA's from the Vietnam War.

Of the 58,220 who died in Vietnam, 48,717 were Enlisted, 6,606 Officers, 1,277 Warrants, and the remaining Army and Marine grunts. 8 Female nurses died in Vietnam.

Oregon State causalities were 708, with Douglas County loosing 29 of her sons.

#### **Background on MyVA**

Launched on September 2, 2014, MyVA is an initiative which will reorient VA around Veteran needs and empower employees to assist them in delivering excellent customer service to improve the Veteran experience. - 4) Establishing a culture of continuous improvement, and
- 5) Enhancing strategic partnerships.

# Panel weighs closing all VA Medical Centers

**Veteran Organizations raise opposition**

A blue-ribbon panel created to evaluate the Veterans Affairs health system is weighing a radical proposal to eliminate all VA medical centers and outpatient facilities in the next 20 years and transition 9 million veterans to the private sector for health care.

A 34-page "strawman document"

floated last week by seven of 15 members of the VA Commission on Care calls for giving all veterans immediate access to private health services and closing VA health facilities gradually, starting with those that are obsolete or underutilized in a process similar to a base realignment and closure.

VA eventually would become "primarily a payer," much like Medicare, under the proposal.

Of the seven commission members whose names appear on the document, three are from the private sector and one is a board member of a veterans advocacy group that has proposed its own plan to expand privatized health care for veterans.

Eight veterans organizations — including the <u>American Legion</u>, sent a letter Thursday to Commission Chairwoman Nancy Schlichting denouncing the document.

"We are greatly alarmed by the proposed strawman document that was developed and drafted outside the open commission process ... without the input or even knowledge of the other commissioners," wrote organization officials. "What is most unsettling about the 'proposed strawman document' is the utter lack of consideration that veterans would want to improve and expand the VA health care system."




