Ministry Notes

Days are getting shorter; nights are getting cooler. Kids are getting ready for school. I have a picture of my first day of Kindergarten. I'm standing next to my older brother and we are dressed up almost like twins. Same jackets, shoes, hair... He's just a few inches taller.

I don't remember being scared. In the picture I've got a rug under my elbow and I'm holding a shoe box. I have no idea what was in the shoe box, but I do remember the rug was for taking a nap on. I don't know how kindergarten is these days, but in those days, Kindergarten was only half a day—and we still had to take a nap!

I loved school. Lincoln Elementary was a big old brick building. Two floors and a creepy basement (that's where the music lessons happened). I loved the structure of school; I loved my teachers. I was always happy for summer, but I was equally happy when school was starting again. My best friend Danny lived on a farm about half a mile away. We rode the bus together everyday and pretty much did everything together. School meant hanging out with friends.

I loved math because it made sense to me. I didn't like grammar, that didn't make any sense to me. I was never in the fastest reading group. But I was always a straight C student. C meant commendable. Which was better than a U, which meant unsatisfactory.

I have vivid memories of learning multiplication. Once I understood the concept, my brain ran with it and I was happy as a clam to memorize all the multiplication tables. Mrs. Newman had me teaching other kids. There was just something about putting all the dots together and understanding how it all worked. It was energizing! It's like putting together a puzzle, and seeing the bigger picture. There's an element of surprise... I think learning is essentially fun.

We are all learning all the time. Whether it's in school or on a job, or just figuring out how the phone works! Good grief, we all have a lot of learning to do these days just to keep up with everything!

We know learning can be fun; and learning can also be extremely frustrating. When something just doesn't make any sense, and we're pressured to know it. In my previous call I had to learn how to use an electronic calendar. It was so frustrating...

A good education will teach you a lot; a good education will also teach you how little you know. Seminary was like drinking from a fire hose. They wanted us to learn so much stuff! And every class had a bibliography, meaning "check out these other books we didn't read!" Christianity is a big subject. There is so much to know.

And we can never know everything. Natural curiosity is always a healthy attitude. I love bible studies. I love the men's bible study on Saturday morning and the Welca bible studies. It's always good conversation and it builds community. Always safe places to ask questions and learn from each other.

Sunday School is starting in September. I pray for all the dedicated teachers and the kids. We will have confirmation starting on Wednesday night, October 2^{nd} at Cross of Christ at 7pm.

In the rhythm of the year, this is where we recommit to learning and passing on the faith. I pray this will be a wonderful year of asking questions, looking for answers, and finding God in places we never expected to see.

Meeting was called to order by vice president, Bill Bodin.

Deacon Todd led us in devotions.

Secretary's report for the June 13, 2019 council meeting was read. Rick had heard from the county that they hadn't applied chloride to the road in front of church because work had been done to that area of the road so the chloride wasn't needed. This correction was made to the minutes.

Treasurer's reports for June and July 2019 were read and approved.

Deacon' Report: Deacon Todd discussed the positive comments he had heard about the potluck, outside worship service and bonfire we had on Aug. 3. It was a good turn-out and everyone seemed to have a great time. We probably want to make it an annual event.

Todd and Chris will be on vacation from Sept. 11-Sept. 30. Fill-in pastors have been set up.

Confirmation will be starting in October.

Old Business:

- 1. The Cemetery Board has approved the new Cemetery Guidelines. These new guidelines have gone into effect. Copies of the new guidelines will be available at church and discussed at the next annual meeting.
- 2. Pastor Torgerson's family had contacted Deacon Todd and expressed their wishes to have Pastor Torgerson's cremated remains buried at the Cannon River Cemetery. The plot has been decided upon but no date has been set.

New Business:

- 1. A motion was made and approved to pay \$1000 towards a large dental bill for Mark Beebe.
- 2. All are welcome to attend the Installation of Rev. Regina Marie Downing Hassanally as the fourth bishop of the Southeastern Minnesota Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America on Sept. 14 at St. John Lutheran Church in Owatonna, Mn. The invitation is posted on the bulletin board.
- 3. Bill Bodin reviewed with all in attendance what to do if there is a problem with the lift, such as the lift stopping while a person is inside. It was decided whichever council member is on each week should check the lift to be sure it's in working order.

The next council meeting will be a joint meeting with Cross of Christ at 6:30 on Thursday, Sept. 12.

Meeting adjourned and we closed with the Lord's Prayer.



Financial News

Missions: Between June and July, \$170 was spent on community suppers. In July, we gave \$200 to Karen Anderson for her mission in Chile, and \$200 to Pastor Wal Reat for his South Sudan mission.

Memorials: In July and August, we received \$4,500 in memory of Carl and Bernice Gustafson for the new air conditioners. In July we received \$10,000 in memory of Vayda Kaiser for the new windows in Dahlen Hall.

The bill for the A/C units came to \$10,265, and has been paid. Roughly half of that has been covered by donations, memorials and a \$400 rebate from Dakota Electric.

Cannon River donated \$500 to the Dahlen Hall remodel.

We gave a \$1,000 scholarship to Kelsey Dinndorf in July. We received a donation of \$150 to offset the cost of the youth Paddleboat outing.

We sold the church's old lawn mower for \$3,000, which went into the Building and Grounds fund.

Prairie Island Cemetery was paid \$500 for maintenance for the year, from the maintenance expense fund.

We received our quarterly deposit from our American National account in June, totaling \$1235.95.

The **Kwik Trip card** sales have made a big difference for us. If you frequent Kwik Trip, contact Julie Schriefels at 388-2326 to buy some pre-paid cards. A portion of your purchase price comes directly to Cross of Christ. It is a very easy way to support your church!

The Church Council approved the new Guidelines for Youth Camps/Trips

Guidelines for Youth Camps/Trips

**Financial hardship should never deter youth from participating in church events. Finances are available to help pay for youth to participate if this is an issue.

Confirmation Camp

Confirmation cam should no longer be a requirement to be confirmed. Good Earth Village (GEV) offers Confirmation camp as an extension (sometimes in place of) a church's own Confirmation program. Todd can easily cover everything he want to during confirmation classes.

However, we do want to encourage our youth to attend GEV. The church will contribute up to \$250/child to their camp experience from the Education Fund. Costs above \$250 will be the camper's family's responsibility.

Youth Outings

The church will pay 50%-75% of the cost of normal (1 day) youth outings, not to exceed \$20/youth. The amount the youth will be asked to pay will be at the Pastor's discretion.

Each youth may bring one friend, whose cost will be the same as the member's. The 2^{nd} , 3^{rd} , 4^{th} , etc. friend will be expected to pay the full cost.

Adults (members and non-members) will be expected to pay full price for any outings with the youth. Adults who volunteer to chaperone youth members will be reimbursed for mileage.

The camp scholarship form has been reworded to reflect these changes.

The meeting was called to order by President Ron Hanson and the mission statement was read.

Devotions were given by Deacon Todd Portinga.

The agenda was approved and the June meeting minutes were approved as written.

Unfinished Business

*Deacon's Report

Todd updated the council on a constitutional change voted on at the churchwide assembly in Milwaukee. Word and service deacons are now ordained instead of consecrated. Deacon Todd is now an ordained deacon.

Nick and Mary Brandvold were received into membership August 11th. Their daughter Noel will be baptized October 13th.

Deacon Todd will be on leave September 11th – 30th.

A nonmember wedding is scheduled for November 2nd.

Windows have been installed. A piece of window trim will be replaced this coming week.

Julie Schreifels gave a project update. One bid has been received. Council will seek at least one more additional bid.

New Business

*September Council Person – Robin Nelson-Williams *Kitchen Guidelines Guidelines have been updated. Updates were made to nonchurch function use by members and nonmembers. *A motion was made and seconded to approve the updated kitchen guidelines.* -Motion Passed

*Youth Guidelines

Financial guidelines for youth and learning activities were reviewed by Julie Schreifels. *A motion was made and seconded to approve the guidelines as presented by the Youth & Leaning Committee.* -Motion Passed

*Dahlen Hall Windows

Council discussed thank yous for Dahlen Hall window donations. It was noted that between the two garage sales, member donations and a memorial gift the cost of the window project was covered without having to use building and grounds maintenance funds.

*Sound System

Ron Hanson brought up the availability of portable sound systems for Sunday worshipers. It was decided to publish the availability in the Chronicles and Sunday bulletins.

*L.P. Contract

Joan Slingsby reported that Ag Partners has bid \$1.13 for the 2019-20 heating season ending March 31th. Last heating season we used 4,751 gallons. It was decided to contract for 4,250 gallons based on the severity of last winter and the new windows in Dahlen Hall. *Blinds

Joan Slingsby shared information on solar window shades for the new windows. She will gather further information on price for council consideration.

*Plants

Bob and Sandy Luhman have offered to donate stonecrop perennials to be placed at the front entrance to replace the dying shrubs which were removed last year. Ron will give them the go ahead to proceed.

*Fire Department Donation

A donation to the Miesville Fire Department was discussed. It was decided to donate \$500 from the Undesignated Trust Fund Investment Church Growth Fund.

Committee Reports

*Finance

It was decided to reimburse the church custodian \$50 on a one-time basis for heavy rain clean up in the old church basement in May. *A motion was made and seconded to approve the financial*

secretary's reports for June and July as written. – Motion passed *Property Management

New sanctuary light bulbs will be installed in the fall.

Recent sewer backup was due to a toilet left running.

Church lawn mover has been sold for \$3,000. Proceeds were deposited in the building and grounds fund.

Loose shingle on church sanctuary has been repaired.

Joan & Ken Slingsby donated two handicapped toilet stools for the basement bathrooms. Steve Schaaf installed them.

Window wells for church basement were replaced/repaired by Steve Schaaf.

Dahlen Hall rain gutters have been repaired.
