From Fr. Francisco 's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters,

"A good tree does not bear rotten fruit,

nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit.

For every tree is known by its own fruit."



These words of Jesus Christ are very important today as we approach Lent and the possibility of conversion. We need to take a

hard look at our fruits. What fruits you may ask; well, the fruits of your life. Let me elaborate a little using the Gospel of last week; when people do something that you don't like, do you give the sweet fruit of understanding and patience or the bitter fruit of resentment and anger? That is why by our fruits we shall be recognized. If we say that we are Christians, it means that we give the fruits of a Christian — love, patience, understanding, be-lieves everything, doesn't hold a grudge. If we don't that means that we need to "convert" — to turn back to God so that He may grant us to give the sweet fruit of a Christian.

On Wednesday we will start Lent with Ash Wednesday. I invite you to come not as a magic thing, but with the desire to convert and to turn back to God. Let us use the time of Lent and its weapons of Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. To help, as a parish we will do "Rice Bowl" during Lent so that we can all have a concrete way to participate in the Lenten exercises.

The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Firdays of lent ar edays of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one full meal is permitted and two  $\binom{2}{2}$  smaller meals, which, if added together would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

- 2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- 3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- 4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty\*) extenda from the <u>First Sun-</u> <u>day of Lent, March 10, 2019 to The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, June 16, 2019.</u>

\* Canon 920, 1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist,

are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.



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
