


A Few Words from the President

The Art of Magic

"The art of magic has undergone considerable changes these past few years. The day is almost over when magicians, generally, make any serious attempt to fool the public. They now regard themselves as entertainers, pure and simple. Their tricks are devised with this in mind.

To enable the amateur to keep in step with this changed conception of magic, this mbook has been devised with several new features in mind. First of all, the trick is presented in its entirety. Then follows the accompanying "patter" or monologue which the magician uses in performing each trick. Then, insofar as possible, each trick has been carefully intergrated with the monologue that accompanies it

so that the embryo magician may rehearse each part together and thus achieve a smoother result. Lastly, instead of presenting a vast number of tricks, fewer have been chosen, and all of them arranged so that they may be presented as a series of four complete acts, or separately, as the case may be.

Then, too, the tricks in this volume have been selected with two points in mind. First of all, they are easy to do, and second, they require no difficult or expensive apparatus, both often beyond the amateur's means or inclination.

With these thoughts in mind, the amateur, picking up this book for the first time, should through consistent practice be able to give an acceptable show."

An acceptable show. Of course, we should all attempt to achieve more than an "acceptable" show. But, remember, if the audience is there to see you, they love magic, and whatever you show them, will be enough to thrill and cause them to want more.

While I was having lunch the other day with Kathy at a local restaurant, I saw a couple with their young daughter. They were a young couple, and the little girl was close to 2 years old. I watched as the young father stripped off he paper from the straw, bunching it up into a tight little ball. He then dipped his straw into the glass of water and took up some of the liquid into it. The curly headed tot watched with wide-eyed curiosity about what his daddy was doing. He held the straw over the paper and let fall a couple of drops onto it. Suddenly, the paper became a writhing caterpillar! The girl squealed and jumped begging for her daddy to make it crawl again. I could tell that he was not a professional magician, and that he probably learned this little straw trick when he was a youngster. We know why this trick works, but this little girl saw real magic. I saw it also, in the little girl's reaction. Never forget the tricks you all learned from years ago. Just because you don't do this trick anymore doesn't mean they lose their magic.
