PROGRAM ACHIEVEMENTS

1. Integrated internship experiences with workshop sessions by providing space for interns to reflect upon accomplishments and challenges faced within internship placements.

2. Allowed group guidelines and process to be designed and maintained by youth interns with the assistance of the Youth Coordinator.

3. Provided viable opportunities for youth interns to learn new skills for community action through curriculum and activities included in weekly workshops.

4. Connected interns with fellow local youth leaders by incorporating facilitators from Young Women Changing Communities (YWCC).

5. Empowered youth to explore the history of social movements and organizing through activities and guest speakers.

6. Exposed youth to traditional and alternative forms of education and employment.

These young women will apply the skills they acquired to their leadership positions in the community, as well as in their respective educational and professional endeavors. Partnership with Young Women Changing Communities (YWCC)

In order to foster meaningful participation and engagement, an important component of youth empowerment, the Cody Rouge summer interns partnered with **Young Women Changing Communities**, a youth leadership group for girls aged 13-20. For a portion of each weekly workshop, this group joined the interns to facilitate an *Emerging Leaders Training*, which incorporates activities centered upon the importance of community engagement, displaying the qualities of a leader, how to effectively make change through participation in youth advisory groups, self-awareness, and advocacy.

As a result of this partnership, the two groups of youth developed meaningful relationships and a professional network of their peers. Additionally, all participants were able to engage in critical thinking, individual reflection, and creative problem-solving.
