CAT Freedom Accessible Taxi is a program from Chatham Area Transit Authority (CAT) that helps increase mobility options for the citizens of Chatham County and removes the barriers that prevent riders from moving freely within the County. CAT Freedom is an accessible taxicab program that operates 24 hours a day 7 days per week. CAT has a fleet of three (3) accessible minivans for the operation of the taxi service.

The cost of service for CAT Freedom is a metered rate service. CAT Freedom is a fare-based program and has no mileage limitations (provided that you remain within Chatham County). Passengers are encouraged to use CAT Freedom Vouchers, which pay for fares at discounted rate. For more information regarding the Voucher program or CAT Freedom please call 912-233-5767.

BATTLEFIELD PARK (A) (40) Hallowed ground where more than 800 men died in the Revolutionary War's Siege of Savannah October 9, 1779.

BEACH INSTITUTE (A) (42) 502 Harris St., 912-234-8800 Elevator entrance on left side of building near rear. African-American Cultural Center - first school for blacks 1867.

CATHEDRAL OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST (A) (41) 222 E. Harris St., 912-233-4709 Elevator entrance on right side of building. Mass – Sunday 8, 10, 11 a.m., and 1 p.m. (Latin); Mass – Mon. thru Sat. at noon and Sat. 5:30 p.m.

CHRIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH (A) (16) 28 Bull St., 912-232-4131 Accessible entrance to elevator on left side of building. It is the “mother church” of the colony of Georgia. Sunday services – 8 & 10 a.m.

GEORGIA HISTORICAL SOCIETY (A) (53) 501 Whittaker St., 912-651-2125 A collection of historical documents and relics relating to Savannah and Georgia.

GREENE-MELDRIM HOUSE (A) (46) 14 W. Macon St., 912-233-3845 General William Tecumseh Sherman's headquarters during the North's occupation of Savannah.

FIRST AFRICAN BAPTIST CHURCH (A) (13) 23 Montgomery St., 912-233-4903 Formed from the oldest African-American congregation in the Savannah area. Accessible entrance on left side of building. Sunday services – 7:45 a.m. and 10:30 a.m.

FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH (A) (36) 223 Bull St., 912-234-2671 Oldest church building in Savannah, and one of the few churches which remained open during the Civil War. Accessible entrance on left side of building. Sunday service – 11 a.m.

FIRST BRYAN BAPTIST CHURCH (A) (11) 575 W. Bryan St., 912-232-5526 Also formed from the oldest African-American congregation in the Savannah area. Sunday service – 11 a.m.

HARPER-FOWLKES HOUSE (A) (ORLEANS SQUARE) 230 Barnard St., 912-234-2180 An 1842 Greek Revival mansion is now the headquarters of The Society of the Cincinnati in the State of Ga. Call ahead for courtyard entrance of elevator.

INDEPENDENT PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH (A) (35) 207 Bull St., 912-236-3346 Accessible entrance on right side of building through small courtyard. Sunday services – 11:00 a.m. And 5:30 p.m. Building is also being used by **Christ Church Anglican** for Sunday services – 8 a.m., 9 a.m., & 9 p.m.

ISAIAH DAVENPORT HOUSE (LA) (21) 324 E. State St., 912-236-8097 Gift shop on ground level is accessible. Upon request, a DVD showing a guided tour of the museum will be shown at no charge. Call ahead for other special needs programs. Example of Federal style houses.

JULIETTE GORDON LOW BIRTHPLACE (A) (32) 10 E. Oglethorpe Ave., 912-233-4501 Founder of the Girl Scouts. Use courtyard entrance to elevator behind house.

MASSIE HERITAGE CENTER (A) (56) 207 E. Gordon St., 912-201-5070 Savannah's first free public school - 1856. Use the courtyard entrance on right side of building.

OWENS-THOMAS HOUSE (LA) (22) 124 Abercorn St., 912-790-8879 A closed captioned DVD of the House tour is available for viewing in the Carriage House Orientation Gallery. Example of English Regency Period. Use courtyard entrance on right side of building.

TRANSPORTATION & PARKING OPTIONS

DOT-DOWNTOWN TRANSPORTATION

The dot Fare-Free Downtown Transportation System, which is available to residents and visitors, is comprised of three interconnected transportation platforms, the Express Shuttle, the River Street Streetcar and the Savannah Belles Ferry, all wheelchair accessible; all fare-free.

- Express Shuttle providing service to 10 downtown stops on a 20 minute frequency
- River Street Streetcar providing service to 7 stops located along one mile of track on River Street
- Savannah Belles Ferry providing daily service between River Street and Hutchinson Island

PARKING



The City of Savannah provides accessible parking spaces for the exclusive use of vehicles displaying the appropriate permit. These parking spaces are located in City-owned garages, City operated lots (River Street lots) and on-street. All permit spaces designated for accessible parking require payment for parking. However, after 5:00 p.m. on weekdays and all day on Saturday, Sunday and holidays, on-street parking is free. For more information, please call 912-651-6470.

SPECIAL USE OF METERED SPACES

Most spaces in downtown Savannah are metered (including accessible spaces). While the City has attempted to make the parking kiosk accessible, some individuals with disabilities may be unable to access the meter because of a mobility issue or be unable to manipulate the meter because of difficulty in dexterity. If you have such a physical disability that makes you unable to use a single or multi-space parking meter, please contact the Department of Mobility and Parking Services, Enforcement Division for assistance at (912) 651-6470. The Department will make arrangements with you that will allow for the use of metered spaces within the City while avoiding the possibility of receiving citations. Requests and assistance are taken on a case-by-case basis throughout the year.


