

Want Another Party Notified?

Some residential customers wish to designate a third party to receive copies of special notices that may be sent to them by Intermountain Rural Electric Association. For example, when a customer's unexpected absence or unavailability causes a bill to remain unpaid for a prolonged period, a third party can take steps in time to prevent a possible shutoff of electric service. The designated third party may be a relative, personal friend, or even an agency.

Landlords may also wish to receive or to have a designated agent receive notice to protect property under lease.

Intermountain REA attempts to reach customers with past due accounts in advance of the time electric service is disconnected. A shutoff notice is sent only as a last resort.

Completion of the attached form will authorize Intermountain REA to send a copy of such a notice to the third party designated so the third party will be informed of the situation.

REQUEST TO NOTIFY ADDITIONAL PARTY

(Must be signed by both Authorizing Customer and Designated Third Party)

This authorizes Intermountain Rural Electric Association to mail a duplicate copy of special notices - including any concerning a possible discontinuance of electric service because of non-payment of bills - to the party named below:
