Prize List Rules & Regulations

- A Membership fee of \$5.00 entitles one (1) adult and any Junior member of that
 family to exhibit. Membership to exhibit (hall class) MUST be purchased prior to
 Thursday of Labour Day weekend.
- All exhibits must be the bona fide property and work of, grown by or produced by the Exhibitor and of the current year, unless otherwise stated.
- 3. All exhibits are to be placed in the hall by 12 pm on Thursday before fair, judging starting at 2 pm.
- 4. ALL EXHIBITS, EXCEPT <u>SPONSORED</u> PERISHABLE ITEMS, SHALL REMAIN IN THE MAIN HALL UNTIL 4:00 PM SUNDAY, AT WHICH TIME THE HALL WILL BE EMPTIED OF SPECTATORS. ONLY AFTER THIS HAS BEEN COMPLETED WILL THE PUBLIC (INCLUDING EXHIBITORS) BE RE-ADMITTED TO THE HALL.
- 5. The decision of the Judges shall be final unless it is shown that a Rule of the Fair has been violated. The Judges shall use their discretion in the awarding of prizes and may refuse a prize when they deem there is no competition or that an exhibit is unworthy.
- 6. The Judges are authorized by the Board of Directors to discard old, soiled or defaced work and are to award prizes to new and up to date work.
- Any article of exhibit competing for a Special prize is not to compete for a Society prize except where otherwise mentioned.
- 8. No farm produce of the same variety shall be entered for more than one prize per category. Entries of different varieties of grain will be allowed and may be grown or produced the previous year.
- The Society will not be responsible for delivery of Special (sponsored) prizes.
 Delivery of <u>WINNING</u> sponsored items not picked up by sponsors will be the responsibility of the exhibitor.
- 10. The Directors shall take every reasonable precaution to ensure the safety of exhibits sent to the Fair but the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting them. Should any exhibit be accidentally damaged, injured or lost, the Directors will give all the assistance in their power to the recovery of same, but they wish it distinctly understood that they will make no payment for any exhibit damaged, injured, lost or stolen.
- 11. It shall be lawful for and the duty of the Treasurer to retain the Annual Membership fee from any prize monies awarded to an exhibitor, as payment of said membership for the following year.
- 12. Prize money will be disbursed at Awards Night, if unable to attend, make alternate arrangements with Secretary.
- 13. Buildings and the Exhibits will be open for public viewing from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm Saturday & 10:00 am to 3:30 pm Sunday.
- 14. The Rules of the Society must be followed or all prize monies shall be forfeited.
- 15. Judging errors to be reported to judge/district up until close of fair. After which, to be reported to the board, in writing, at next general meeting.

PLEASE DO NOT START TAKING OUT YOUR EXHIBITS BEFORE THE SPECIFIED TIME. PLEASE SPEAK TO SECRETARY, TREASURER OR A DIRECTOR FOR SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES.

DAY OF SHOW: SATURDAY

Rules:

- 1. Entries close one (1) week prior to Fair Day. For Director/Individual in charge please see Special List.
- 2. Junior's use same class and section as seniors, with "JR" in front of class number. Juniors exhibit under family membership, membership number to be shown on entry tag.
- 3. No more than two 2) entries per class and no more than forty 40) entries allowed per paid membership. There is no entry fee for seniors or juniors.
- 4. Entries are to be cooped (placed in cages) between 7:30 am and 9:30 am the day of the show. Judging will start at 10:00 am. Removal time is 4:30 pm.
- 5. Standard bantam and pigeon classes: AV (any variety), AOV (any other variety), AC (any colour), or AOC (any other colour) entries must be correctly named.
- 6. All <u>PIGEONS</u> entered as young birds must have seamless bands of the current year.
- 7. Judging will be under the Standard of Perfection by a licensed poultry judge. Interference during judging will not be tolerated and the prizes will be awarded as the judge sees fit.
- 8. Unhealthy or extremely dirty exhibits will be disqualified and removed from the building.
- 9. All other rules of the Society must be followed.
- 10. A class will be created when two or more exhibitors show six or more exhibits per breed or colour (properly named) created when two or more exhibitors show six or more exhibits per breed or colour (properly named).

ONTARIO ASSOCIATION OF AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY (OAAS) QUILT COMPETITION

A complete list of Rules and Regulations are available from the Secretary on Request, also available in Special Prize list. Partial list of most important rules:

- 1. Entries must be quilted by a member of the Powassan Agricultural Society.
- 2. Quilts size: perimeter 324"
- 3. Each local Fair is entitled to send the Grand Champion Quilt to the District Annual Meeting Competition If an exhibitor wins Grand Champion or Best of Show of all Classes at other than his/her own Fair, or at more than one Fair, the exhibitor must consider the Agricultural Society nearest his/her home address as the one from which the quilt will be sent to the District 11 Meeting. An exhibitor winning more than one "Best of Show" with a different quilt each time shall be entitled to enter each winning quilt to compete at the District 11 Annual Meeting Competition. If Quilt entered has previously qualified as Grand Champion at another fair, please indicate on entry tag, as it is not eligible for Grand Champion at this Fair.

- 4. The first prize Quilt from the District 11 Competition is then entered in the OAAS Competition, which is held at the OAAS Annual Convention in Toronto in February. The entry judged BEST OF SHOW at the Convention will be declared the OAAS CHAMPIONSHIP QUILT. A \$500.00 grand prize will be awarded and the Exhibitor will retain ownership of the Quilt. A certificate and ribbons will also be awarded.
- 5. There will be a 2nd place prize of \$150.00 awarded to the Runner Up Quilt. Exhibitor retains ownership of Quilt.
- 6. The exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the OAAS competition. The winning OAAS Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future District or OAAS Competitions.
