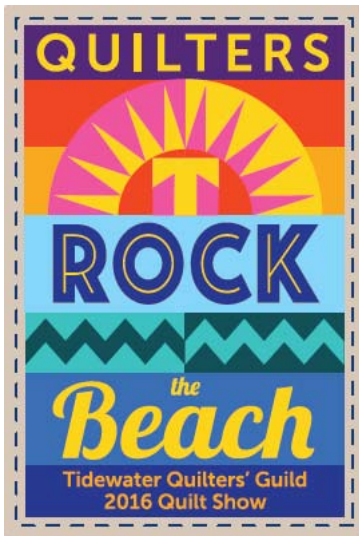

- **President's Message**—Isobel Meekins thanked the current board members and asked for a round of applause for their service. She thanked Susan Waddles, who has agreed to chair the Fall Festival again. De Lovell will audit the Guild's books. We need volunteers for the Christmas Mystery. Isobel asked that everyone wear a nametag. If someone forgets their nametag, they should give 50 cents to Sandy Barnes.
- **Thank You**—Jeanne Vault thanked Jeanne Surber for her work as night coordinator, and presented her with friendship blocks made by the members.
- **Workshops**—Jeanne Vault, Vice President, announced that Sarah Madsen will teach an applique workshop on Saturday, May 25, from 9:45 A. M. until 4:00 P.M at the Grafton Christian Church. There are still 5 slots available. The cost is \$20.00, plus \$30.00 for the kit, payable to Sarah on the day of the workshop.

Gala announced that the widow of the trooper who recently died received a quilt.

From the Challenge Committee

Challenge Quilts are due in October. Judging happens first at the Night Guild on October 11 and again at the Day Guild on Oct 14. All quilts will be hung and voted on at both meetings.

We need your artist statements at the July meetings. Sorry, but we have a deadline to meet for Mancuso. We will type the artist statements for you. I looked through American Quilter Magazine, Quilting Arts, and American Quilter for inspiration.

I found an explanation published in Quilting Arts April/May 2016 that may help. "An artist statement is different from a bio or short biography. An artist statement should always be written in the first person rather than the third person style used for a bio. Your bio is where you include highlights from your resume such as exhibitions, books, education, and awards. Your artist statement is where you include highlights of your techniques, materials, inspiration and processes." The April/May issue of Quilting Arts Magazine had an article by Sue Blevin titled "Writing an Artist Statement."

The artist statement connects you and the viewer. Some quilters are inspired by events such as the refugee crisis, a hobby, a collection of fabrics, a new technique, or photographs. What is your passion or inspiration and how do you express it in a quilt?

There was one revision to the rules. Instead of 34" by 50" the new dimension allows 34-36" by 49-51". The following requirements are unchanged. The quilt top must contain one or more quilt blocks of any size in any location. It must have three or more borders plus a binding. The back is to contain any size pieces of all fabrics used on the front. Fabrics and colors are your choice. You may not use a kit or

embellishments other than needle and thread. Qualifying quilts will be eligible to hang in the 2017 Mid Atlantic Quilt Show. Participants must be 2016 members of PPQG. It isn't too late to sign up.

Service Project Update:

Nine wheel chair lap quilts were recently taken to Riverside Hospital for patients receiving cancer treatments. Keep making the lap quilts so we can deliver more next time. These quilts can be made using a yard of fabric and some orphan blocks. 32 inches by 36 inches is a good size and flannel can be used on the back. Comfort quilts for babies in the NICU at CHKD and Portsmouth can be made from 24 inches to 38 inches. Isolette covers 50 inches wide by 40 inches long are still being accepted.
