Dear Fellow Quilters,

The Colonial Piecemakers Quilt Guild cordially invites the members of your guild to join us on our annual bus trip to the Quilters Unlimited 46th Annual Quilt Show at the Dulles Expo Center in Chantilly, Virginia on Friday, May 31, 2019. The cost is \$60 per person, and this will include a simple breakfast snack with juice.

Oleta Coach Lines is our bus service provider and has a long standing record of safety and reliability. Our coach will leave from the Walmart Supercenter at 731 Rochambeau Dr., Williamsburg, Virginia at 7:30 a.m. Please arrive no later than 7:15 a.m. to allow time to hand out the snack, and get everyone checked in and boarded. You will find the bus near the IHOP. This is a full size bus which features a restroom, cargo hold and wi-fi.

The Expo Center offers sandwiches and snacks for purchase, and there are restaurants within walking distance.

You may bring your own food and small cooler to fit under the bus seat. At a pre-determined time mid-day the bus will be accessible to you so you may drop off your morning purchases and eat the lunch you may bring.

Our bus will depart the Expo Center at 3 p.m. and should arrive back at the Walmart Supercenter around 7-7:30 p.m. depending on traffic conditions.

Payment must be made in advance as soon as possible. Space is limited, so first come, first served. Quiltmania will also have a vendor booth and will offer fabric lines, books, and patterns usually unavailable in the U.S. The show will also feature over 500 beautiful quilts, and 70 vendors.

Small Service Project Update

Kim Beatley delivered 14 baby quilts and 75 fabric hearts to CHKD on March 19. An announcement was made at both March meetings of the following small service challenge:

Small Service Project Challenge 2019

 The intent of the challenge is to increase the number of completed small service projects for the year. A secondary benefit will be to use some of your stash so you have room for new fabric. We have kits made up that you are welcome to use; you may use your own fabric, or any combination of the two. There are two parts to the challenge.

Pillowcases

 For each completed pillowcase turned in your name will go in a drawing to be held at the September day chapter meeting. There will be two prizes awarded, one to the person whose name is drawn, and another to the person who turns in the highest number of pillowcases.

Quilts

• For each completed quilt turned in your name will go in a drawing to be held at the September day chapter meeting. Each long arm quilter who quilts one of these quilts will also go into the drawing. There will be three prizes awarded, one to the person whose name is drawn; another to the person who turns in the highest number of quilts and a third to the long arm quilter who quilts the highest number of quilts. Limit one prize per person. Beginning with the April meetings there will also be a mini drawing at each meeting for all quilts turned in that month for a fat quarter. For tracking, it is important that you give your name and/or the quilter's name when turning in quilts.

Approximate sizes for the quilts:

- Bereavement-24" x 24"
- Baby—30" x 36"
- Lap/throw—40" x 48"

We are requesting that you use good quality fabric that you would be happy to give a friend or family member. Fabric with glitter or metallic thread is not allowed. Riverside Hospital will receive bereavement quilts, baby quilts, and throw quilts for their chemo and NODA patients. CHKD will receive bereavement quilts and baby quilts.
