Update on Service Projects

Thank you to those that brought in quilts, fabric hearts and pillowcases to the March meetings. We received four lap quilts, seven baby quilts and fifty fabric hearts. You ladies really like to make the pillowcases for the children with cancer at MCV Hospital in Richmond. At the day chapter meeting, I received 81 pillowcases. Fifty were made by Carolyn Evanoff. At the night chapter meeting, I received 35 pillowcases. Sixteen were made by Sherry Behun and Rosemary brought me eight more. These will go to the Blue Crab Quilt Company in Richmond in addition to the forty seven Denise Vassar took there in February. You can continue to support small service projects in the following ways:

Small baby quilts for families with need at Riverside Hospital and comfort quilts for babies in CHKD NICU palliative care. A good size for these quilts is approximately 30" x 36" or 26 inch square for the bereavement quilts.

Fabric hearts for Mothers with babies in NICU at Riverside and CHKD.

Full size pillowcases made with bright, happy novelty fabric are for children with cancer at MCV in Richmond. They should be made with 100% cotton fabric. Don't use flannel or fabric with glitter. It takes 3/4 of a yard of bright novelty fabric and about 1/4 yard contrasting fabric for the band. Instructions are on the web site and or use your favorite method of making pillowcases. Finished pillowcases will be taken to the Blue Crab Quilt Co. in Richmond for distribution at MCV Hospital.

PPQG Day Chapter Minutes For February 9, 2018

- MINUTES: Pat McGough made a motion to accept the February minutes as published. Lori Murdock seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- **TREASURER'S REPORT:** Tricia Lent made a motion to approve the treasurer's report for audit; seconded by Carol Pittman. Motion carried.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

- Candy Byrd announced that she is selling Coffee Cups with the PPQG logo for \$16 each and that the price will go up to \$18.00 at the Quilt Show. She is also selling tickets for the machine that the guild received from Tidewater Sew/ Vac for our member's participation in their class. Tickets are \$3 each. Each member who attended the class will also receive one free ticket.
- **BLOCK OF THE MONTH:** Pat McGough presented the BOM for April. The block will help you work on your Applique skills with the April Showers Girl. The BOM for March was won by Mark Fowler.
- **MONTHLY MINI:** Amy Mazich and Kathy DeCarlo displayed the monthly minis. Lori Murdoch donated a corded fabric bowl won by De Lovell. Joann Gardner donated a thread and bobbin holder which was won by Sharon Hamlin.
- 2018 QUILT SHOW: Isobel Meekins said that there is still room in the program for individual ads and that she had contracts available at the meeting if anyone would like to have one. Kathy Fowler passed around a sheet for volunteers to provide snacks and drinks for the volunteer room at the quilt show. Tricia Lent reminded everyone that there were clipboards for sign-ups for various activities at the quilt show. Plenty of areas are still in need of volunteers. Help with set-up on Friday and take down on Sunday is needed as well as white gloves to hang quilts. If anyone would like to demonstrate any quilting techniques at the Quilt Show let the committee know as soon as possible. Tickets for the show are \$6 for any guild member from any guild. To receive the discount each member must display their membership card. Regular admission will be \$8. For those displaying quilts, artist's statements need to be turned in to Gina Vivian as soon as possible. The quilt drop off will be Friday, April 7 between 4 and 6 p.m. at Poquoson Middle School. Lisa Hartman is accepting donations for door prizes.
- 2018 RAFFLE QUILT: Gina Vivian announced that tickets were available for the 2018 Raffle Quilt. Cost will be 6 for \$10 or 1 for \$2. She has a sign-up sheet for volunteers to help sell tickets at the quilt show. It's a sit down job if anyone is interested
- **PROGRAM DIRECTOR:** Janette Doucette is our Program Director. She is providing a suggestion box for members to place any suggestions for programs for the coming year. You can also reach her by phone or email. The April day program will be a trunk show presented by Daryl and Randee Tassara. May program will feature the use of various types of threads. The July program will feature the use of scraps and a workshop will be held following the meeting in Isobel's classroom at the Community Center.
- **MEMBERSHIP:** Cathy Fowler announced that rosters had been emailed to members. She has a few printed copies for those who do not have email.
- HONOR QUILTS: TerrI McHenry and Karen Whitley made a trip to Fort Belvoir this month to the Wounded Warrior Care Center. The Center helps service members transition from military service to civilian life. They were able to present 12 quilts and the recipients were very appreciative. She also announced that she has five quilts ready to be quilted if anyone is available.
- **UFOs:** Nancy Shrout and Lois Bates had all members who had completed their UFO #2 present them to the group. There was a big group showing their finished projects. UFO #3 will be due in May.
- **SERVICE PROJECTS:** Gala announced that 47 pillowcases were taken to the Blue Crab Quilt Company in Richmond for distribution. Twenty baby quilts were given to CHKD. Bereavement quilts are need in muted colors. Measurements for the bereavement quilts are 26 x 26.
- **WORKSHOP:** Kitty Tully will be conducting a workshop on March 20, at the Grafton Christian Church from 9:30 to 12:30. Project will be the Easy Shallow Curves pattern. Cost of the workshop is \$12.00. A supply list will be provided at sign up.
- CHALLENGE QUILT 2018: "HAVE PASSPORT WILL TRAVEL." Marilyn Rivera is still accepting registrations for the 2018 Challenge. Feel free to take your quilt theme anywhere you want. You can use, Chinese techniques, Aztec Logs, a Trip around the World quilt, African, Australian themes or any country, mode of transportation or idea that features the International Travel theme. Let your imaginations run wild. Size requirements are a minimum of 24 X 24 inches, with a maximum of 50 X 50 inches.
