An update on some of the ways we've been learning recently.

Despite the cold, children have been making pretend ice-creams. They sold them in a pretend shop, giving the parents pretend money to buy them with. They made lots of pretend money!

We had a spooky time at Halloween! The children had a great time making spiders, play dough pumpkins and did some printing with pumpkins too.

Nutrition/health board: Our new board is on the door to the playroom. There's a new recipe up each week. Please ask a member of staff if you'd like a copy!

The children are having a great time baking! We've recently made scones, pizza, bread and shortbread. Keep those recipes coming in.

Quality Improvement

We're always working hard and trying to improve what we do to make our preschool setting the best it can be for your little ones.

Staff have been offered more permanent roles following a trial period. Kirsty is now our Lead Early Years Educator, with Jo and Helen taking the Deputy Early Years Educator role between them. We're all thrilled with how well the team are working together.

Staff training: Kirsty, our Lead Early Years Educator, is studying at University for her Early Years Foundation Degree. Nicola is also studying for her level 3 Childcare qualification. They're working super hard at the moment!

Staff have worked on the organisation of the playroom, leaving more space for free play. They've also looked more closely at carpet-time, introducing different activities to make it more engaging. Children are being encouraged to stay hydrated throughout the day.

The term there has been a focus on well-being, with the staff completing questionnaires and time in staff meetings set aside to talk about the well-being of the children. Regular cooking activities have been received enthusiastically by the children! Yoga sessions have been introduced into the timetable to give the children some quiet, mindful time.

Don't forget!

It's really cold, brrrrr! Please remember to bring hats and gloves and a warm coat for your children so they can still play outside.

Emergency Closure: We recently reviewed our procedure and emailed it out to all parents. Please familiarise yourself with the document and make sure that we have all your up to date contact details.

We want to keep everyone safe, family members too. So please always use the bottom gate at the entrance to the school. Please note that the school drive is no longer accessible to cars due to new security measures in place at school. This also applies to lunchtime collections and drop offs as we've noticed some parents still using the drive at these times.

Our lending library! Even if you already have books at home, encouraging the children to choose a new one and reading it with them will help to foster a love of reading. Each child has a library card, colour coded according to their key worker. Just fill the card in when you take a new book.

We need to pair the children up with the adult who is collecting them. So please collect your child from the carpet so the staff can clearly see who is going home with who.

Drinks: Please make sure that water bottles only contain water, unless previously organised with staff. Water bottles should not have juice or squash in them.
