2nd/3rd: We will have a spelling test this week on Friday! In science we are starting on Earth Science! We're working on geology! The test will be on Tuesday! In history, we are working on communities, focusing on how to be active citizens in our community. In math, we're working on adding and subtracting fractions. We'll have a test on this on Thursday! 4th/5th: 4th and 5th graders will begin Cinquain poetry in Writing this week. In Math, both grades will have a test on Friday. In Science, 4th graders will be getting ready to test next week over Ch. 9 "Changes to Earth's Surface" and 5th graders will start a new chapter on force and motion. In Comm. Arts, both grades will continue working through their Buckledown and C.A.R.S. workbooks and will look at pronouns and adjectives in English. In Social Studies, 4th graders will look at Missouri symbols and 5th grade will

test over Ch. 2 tomorrow. Both grades will also start Geography this week. For 3rd Quarter book report requirements, students will need to pass one AR book by Fri., January 31st. Then students may pick any book they wish to read on their grade level and we will be completing a Cereal Box book report on that book that will be due Fri., February 28th. 6th/7th/8th: In grammar, students are practicing their skills involving mechanics and usage and the importance of the rules of capitalization, punctuation, and usage both in how we write and comprehend what we read. In science, students are studying earth formations and parts of the solar system. In social studies, sixth grade is studying the early establishment of our nation's government and early efforts at the constitution. Seventh grade is looking at early interactions of America with other continents in the early 18th century. Eighth grade is learning about efforts at early expansion, including the Louisiana Purchase.

NURSE TIP: Ice melt products can be inadvertently brought into the home from the bottom of shoes. Of course, a toddler will not only find it, but will put it right into their mouths. These can include the regular rock salt (sodium chloride) or "premium" ice melts that contain a mixture of various salts, such as potassium chloride, calcium chloride, and magnesium chloride. Mixtures actually reduce the risk of poisoning since they offer a lower dose of any one particular salt, compared to every pellet being the same thing. Keep the bags and buckets of any ice melt product out of sight and reach of children because their salt content can be a problem if swallowed in a large enough amount. -Nurse Amber
