The Prophetic Mantle of the Intercessor

Part Two: Its Kingly Aspect

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In our last issue, we shared about *“The Priestly Aspect of the Mantle of the Intercessor”* and how Jesus was linked to both mantles. The Priestly Mantle, which was assigned to Joshua after Moses’ death, had the main purpose to bring the children of Israel into the Promised Land then occupied by satanic representatives. Joshua was a very clear picture of what Jesus, the Savior of the world, would do for us in the supernatural. Jesus/Joshua/Yeshua, being our High Priest, like Joshua of old, fought on our behalf to restore our inheritance back to us and gave us eternal life. Now for the *Kingly Aspect* of that Mantle, when we look at the genealogy of our Lord, we see that He came from the Tribe of Judah, one of Jacob’s or Israel’s children. Judah was Jacob’s fourth child by his wife Leah.

When the Psalmist David, also a descendant of the Tribe of Judah, became king, God made him a promise that he would always have a descendant on the throne. We recall that David’s son Solomon’s disobedience against God caused

the kingdom to be divided into two kingdoms: the Kingdom of Israel and the Kingdom of the Tribe of Judah. This is proof that, even with David’s descendants’ unfaithfulness, God still kept His promise onto David. Though all the kingdoms of the land became obsolete when they went into captivity centuries later, God, in the most unusual way, brought one kingdom of the scene through the Messiah, the Christ Jesus, our beloved Lord and Savior, to fulfill that promise made unto David many millennia ago. Like Joshua or Yeshua of the Old Testament, our Lord was not only a High Priest in the order of Melchizedek, He was also a King. You can see both functions of Melchizedek, as King and Priest, in the books of Gen 14:18-20, Mat 27:11, Heb 2:17.

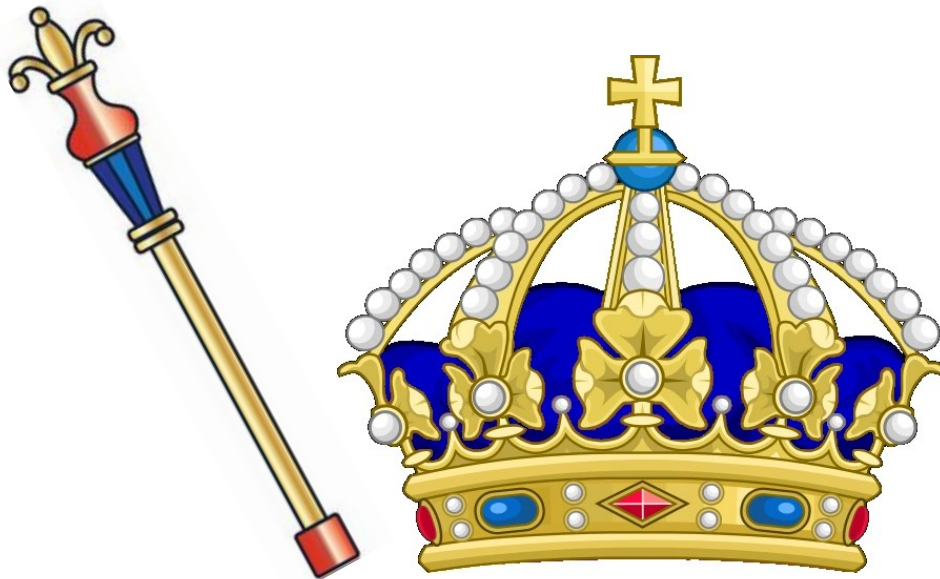
For example, in Gen 14:18-20, Melchizedek fulfilled the duty of a Priest as a type of Christ. In fact, He was called the Priest of the Most High God, ministering before the altar of God, according to Gen 14:18. As the Priest, He brought out bread and wine — the symbol of communion through the broken body and the shed blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, and

He gave it to Abram. As we recall, priests, in the Old Testament, dealt with sacrifices, comprised of a body that was killed, which represent the *Bread* and the blood that was shed from that same body, represented the *Wine*. That was the Priesthood function of Christ, whom Melchizedek represented.

In Hebrews 7:1, Melchizedek, a type of Christ, is once again mentioned as the King of Salem. Note that Salem was the old name for today’s JeruSalem (Salem: Shalom/Peace) the City of Peace, for Jesus was the Prince of Peace. But that same passage shows how very remarkable Melchizedek’s kingship was, in that when He, Jesus, returns to Earth, He will not be returning as a Savior but He will be returning as the Conquering Lion of the Tribe of Judah, the Conquering King. (Rev 6:2 and Rev 19:11. Thus, coming from the Tribe of Judah, Jesus was both a High Priest and a King. While He was on Earth, He fulfilled both. As a *Priest* at the Last Supper and as a *King* when He rode into Jerusalem on a donkey.

Jesus/Joshua/Yeshua conquered all of our enemies, gave us the victory and restored our inheritance.

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This is where we see Jesus' priestly side in Melchizedek. But when it comes to His kingship, we turn to His inheritance through David of the Tribe of Judah, the tribe of Praise. David is called the psalmist. A psalmist writes poetries which are converted into songs. David sang God's praises, most especially when he had to face his enemies. Psalm 18 is one of my favorite psalms where we see David getting into the face of his enemies by praising his God. As Intercessors of ETIPM Global, we have learned that praises play a major part in what we do. It is our top intercessory, our main warfare strategy, the same model used by King Jehoshaphat in 2 Chro 20, which earned him the victory over the three mighty armies of Moab, Ammon and the Meunites. As a ministry, we see prayer as the door, but praise is the key to open that door.

The following points are quotes from my book "**Our Most Effective Breakthrough Weapon**", published in October 2016:

1. "Praise gets our focus off the problem or unfortunate situation and puts it on God;"
2. "Praise brings us into a humble position before God"
3. "You cannot be praising with a sincere heart and be complaining at the same time;"
4. "True praise removes fear, anxiety, hopelessness;"

5. "True praise makes the heart glad and merry, because it renews and refreshes our spirit"
6. "Praise floods our lives with His presence"
7. "Satan definitely cannot stand our praise, so he has no choice but to flee"
8. "Praise brings God's attention to the situation and opens doors for miracles to happen."

According to Dr. Cindy Trimm, "A heart that is filled with praise will get a direct audience with the Father."

The **Kingly Mantle of the Intercessor** gives him or her that access to God through Jesus as the Son of David, the Chief Psalmist. For we are anointed and, as kings, are called to defend territories, to protect His Kingdom on the Earth. We also get to reign as we go behind the Veil with Him, standing at the Altar of Incense with our Chief Intercessor and King, Jesus, commanding nations and destinies to return to their God-ordained original plans and purposes. Moreover, as intercessors, we also get to rule and reign as kings through the offering of praise.

We do have a noble calling on our lives, though not necessarily glamorous. What an honor to know that both the priestly and kingly mantles, bestowed on us through our beloved Lord Jesus

Christ, give us access to God's ears and heart! That's the honor of being able to detect when His Holy Spirit in us is grieving over the things that are happening all around us. Both mantles allow us to humbly fix what has been broken through the deceptions of the wicked one. Yes! Those two mantles give us that kind of power. Because we have that kind of power, we can be privy to God's secrets and act upon them accordingly through prayer. Those mantles also gave us the power to bind, to loose, to give God permission or cause His hand to be held back. Those two mantles (Jesus' Priesthood for intercession, prayer warfare, etc., and His Kingship for praising, ruling and reigning) give us power to be successful in the office of the intercessor.

rines and sang His praises from our starting point from the park, onto Main Street and then returned back to the park in full blown worship.

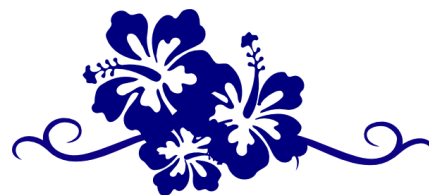
Jewish families and many others stood to watch and listen to us as we declare Jesus Christ as the One True Lord and Savior of all mankind.

This is an excerpt from my September 1, 2017 morning meditation.

As many of you know, I have had a total knee replacement (TKR). For the last few months, I spent my time thinking about the pain and how soon I would get relief! Lately as I continued to get on the prayer line and offer up prayers for others, I noticed that the LORD began to minister to me on how to go through the process of regaining full range of motion of my knee and being able to kneel in His presence, which many of us, even I can take for granted! I used to just kneel in His presence before I had the surgery. Now, I am grateful for the ability to stand up and walk. And I thank God for being able to do simple things like walking up and down the stairs, washing the dishes, cooking meals, washing clothes and lifting things. I still can’t lift a gallon of water, but I am grateful that I can lift 1/2 a gallon, and

my strength is still increasing in that area. I started to ask God to be my strength—not just to give me strength! There is a difference between the two. When God is your strength — you can withstand pain! The first thing the Lord had me do is to change how I speak about my knees when the therapist “ministers” to it! Notice, the word “ministers”, not “crunching!” When I said crunching, the thoughts of pain came to mind, but when I said ministering instead, the thought of getting better came to mind. Also the Lord had me meditate on His Word that He, Himself, is my strength as the therapist “ministers” to my knee! What a difference! Each time I go to the therapist or even to the gym to work out, I pray the Lord to be my strength. Exodus 15:2, “the Lord is my strength and my song: “He has given me VICTORY—this is my God, and I will praise Him—my Father’s God, and I will

exalt Him!” Psalms 118:14. “The Lord is my strength and my song He has given me VICTORY” Isaiah 12:2 “See God has come to save me. I will trust in Him and not be afraid. The Lord God is my strength and my song; He has given me victory.” Habakkuk 3:19 “the sovereign Lord is my strength! He makes me as surefooted as a deer, able to tread upon the heights.” Psalms 28:7 “the Lord is my strength and shield. I trust Him with all my heart! He helps me and my heart is filled with joy! I burst out in songs of thanksgiving.”

The Tongue

The tongue is located on the inferior portion of the mouth just posterior and medial to the teeth. It is a small organ made up of several pairs of muscles covered in a thin, bumpy, skin-like layer. The outside of the tongue contains many rough papillae for gripping food as it is moved by the tongue's muscles. The taste buds on the surface of the tongue detects taste molecules in food and connect to nerves in the tongue to send taste information to the brain. The tongue also helps to push food towards the posterior part of the mouth for swallowing.

The Salivary Gland

Surrounding the mouth are three sets of salivary glands. The salivary glands are

accessory organs that produce a watery secretion known as saliva. Saliva helps to moisten food and begins the digestion of carbohydrates. The body uses saliva to lubricate food as it passes through the mouth, pharynx and esophagus.

The Pharynx ...

...or throat is a funnel shaped tube connected to the posterior end of the mouth. It is responsible for the passing of masses of chewed food from the mouth to the esophagus. The pharynx also plays an important role in the respiratory system, as the air from the nasal cavity passes through the pharynx on its way to the larynx and eventually the lungs.

Because the pharynx serves two different functions, it contains a flap of tissue known as the epiglottis that acts as a switch to route food to the esophagus and air to the larynx.

The Esophagus

Its a muscular tube connecting the pharynx to the stomach that is part of the upper gastrointestinal tract (GI). It carried swallowed masses of chewed food along its length. At the interior end of the esophagus is a muscular ring called the lower esophageal sphincter or cardiac sphincter. Its function is to close the end of the esophagus and trap food in the stomach.
