The Night Chapter Meeting, November 12, 2019, will be the LAST opportunity to sign up for the UFO Challenge and will also be the LAST opportunity to turn in your list of UFOs.

PPQG DAY CHAPTER MINUTES FOR SEPTEMBER 13, 2019

- The Day Chapter meeting was called to order at 10 a.m. by our Day Coordinator, Rita Crawford. We opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance. We had 82 members present, 2 guests: Kathy Thomasson and Denise Anderson, and 3 new members: Lisa Carroll, Janet Platz and past charter member, Debbie Frecker .
- **MINUTES:** Marilyn Rivera made a motion to accept the August minutes as published; Pat McGough seconded the motion; motion carried.
- **TREASURER'S REPORT:** Marilyn Rivera made a motion to accept the treasurer's report for audit; Jeanne Surber seconded and the motion carried.
- Jeanne Surber announced that the PPQG Board was recommending an increase of the guild dues to \$30 and is presenting the recommendation to the general membership. The vote will be made at the October meeting by a show of hands. Reasons for the increase are increased liability insurance, storage fees, and since the dues have not been raised for at least twelve years, the costs of supplies and guest speakers have also increased. Jeanne also asked that, if possible to show up early for the Tuesday night meetings in order to help set up the room and chairs.
- **SYMPOSIUM:** Linda Odell thanked all of the volunteers who have been meeting to help with the organization of the symposium. More volunteers are needed. Registration forms will be ready soon, along with the cost. There will be a special price for the guest speaker in the evening. The next board meeting and symposium meeting will be Monday, October 21.
- **MYSTERY QUILT:** Karen O'Kelley will be sending out the instructions for this year's Mystery Quilt. The 1st step will include the amount of fabric and the cutting instructions. When planning your quilt, keep in mind that it would look good with a scrappy design. Instructions will be sent out monthly and the final quilt will be due in March 2020. There is no fee to participate and the only requirement is that the top must be finished, but it does not need to be quilted and bound.
- **LOCAL WORKSHOPS:** Cathy and Mark Fowler presented some of the dates for upcoming Local workshops. After the meeting today, Marilyn Rivera will be teaching the Ginger Jar Class. On November 23, at the Grafton Christian Church, Rhonda Gianturco will be doing an instructional class on how to use your Deb Tucker rulers. Bring your rulers with you to class. On January 10, 2020, following the Day Chapter meeting, Carol Pittman will be teaching a Beach Bag Class. On January 18, Sandy Curran will be teaching you how to make a Photo Quilt
- **UFO CHALLENGE:** The UFO Queens, Lois Bates and Nancy Shrout are still accepting sign ups for the Challenge. A total of six UFOs will be completed. There is a \$2.00 sign-up fee. Registration Forms are on the PPQG Website.
- **FALL FESTIVAL:** Candy Byrd will be coordinating our Newport News Fall Festival event. Volunteers are still needed. Special help is needed Saturday, October 5, between 2 to 5 p.m., to help take down the quilts for the evening. Parking Passes are available for those helping during the festival. See Candy and she will give you one. If any member wants to offer their services to visitors at the booth, let Candy know what services you offer and she will have a list for them to see. Services you provide are needed for the list. It could be longarm quilting, repairing damaged quilts, making and/or binding quilts and other quilting services that you provide. Contact Candy. Quilts that you would like to show at the Festival can be given to Candy as soon as possible.
- **CHALLENGE QUILT:** Rhonda Gianturco reminded us that Challenge Quilts are due at the November meeting. Artist statements are due by October 11. Details of the Challenge are on the PPQG Website.
- **NOVEMBER WORKSHOP:** Mark Sherman, our National speaker is coming in October. He will be teaching two classes. His Trapunto class will be on Thursday, October 10 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and the class is full. The first stained Glass class has 3 spaces left. Cost of class is \$25 plus \$40 for the Quilt Kit. His Stained-glass class will be on Saturday, October 12 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- **BLOCK OF THE MONTH:** Marilyn Rivera and Pat McGough presented the October BOM which is a Pumpkin. The September winners of the Popsicles and the "Dog Days of Summer" Blocks were drawn and announced; winners were Marilyn Rivera and Joyce McKeel (Dog Days of Summer) and Diane Zeimet, Sara Ware, and Helene Jubie were the winners of the Popsicle Blocks.

2. Please send me the measurements for your quilt (width x height), so I can arrange for enough display space.
3. In order to be judged quilts need to be at both guild meetings in November (Friday, November 8 and Tuesday, November 12). If you are not going to be at the Friday meeting, please get someone else to bring it to the meeting or bring it to me before the meeting. I'll transport the quilts between the Friday and Tuesday meetings. Quilts should be picked up Tuesday night. If you are not going to be there, please let me know, so we can make arrangements.

I've attached a copy of the Challenge instructions (see next page) in case you have lost your copy. If you have any questions, please email me.

All Creatures Great and Small

We all love animals whether it's our pets, zoo animals, or the critters frolicking outside our kitchen window! This year's Challenge, "All Creatures Great and Small," is a tribute to all of them. Our challenge is to make quilts containing animals in the fabric, in the quilting, in the piecing, or in the name of the blocks.

Completed quilts are due Friday, November 8, 2019 and MUST be available for BOTH PPQG meetings in order to be considered for judging. There will be a total of 4 prizes: 1st Place, 2nd Place, 3rd place, and Honorable Mention. Quilts will be judged by PPQG members taking into consideration theme, quilting, color, etc. Quilts will also be displayed at the 2020 Mid-Atlantic Quilt Show in Hampton.

Quilts must fulfill the following criteria:

- 1) Quilts MUST contain at least one Creature (i.e. animal). Quilts can be a pieced animal picture, can use fabric containing an animal, can have an animal in the quilting, or can have blocks with an animal name. Animal content will be verified when presenting quilt for judging.
- 2) Quilts should be completed in 2019. Quilts may not have been in a previous show.
- 3) Quilts may be made using a purchased quilt pattern, but may NOT be made from a kit.
- 4) Quilts must be 60" x 60" or smaller. Size will be verified when presenting quilt for judging.
- 5) Quilts must include a label and a hanging sleeve. Instructions for a hanging sleeve can be found on the PPQG website.

There is a \$2 entrance fee per quilt. Artist Statements, containing quilt name, artist name, and a descriptive paragraph about your quilt, should be emailed to Rhonda Gianturco on or before Friday, October 11, 2019.
