A Note from the Directors Desk By Nancy Turner, Executive Director

December 10th - the day that turned my world upside down. It started out as any other day. I had breakfast with a friend then was off to meet with my primary care doctor to see why my sinus infection wasn't getting any better. I shared with her some pressure I had the night before in my chest. Her look told me that something may not be right. An EKG showed I had a heart attack perhaps 10 days prior or was about to have one. I was put in an ambulance (first time I ever rode in one) and taken to our local hospital. They discovered that I had blockage and the next morning I was in the operating room having triple by-pass surgery. I was numb and couldn't comprehend what was going on. The only thing I remember was a voice telling me; "You will be okay, trust Me."

I had major setbacks after the surgery. Fluid around my lungs slowed down my rehab. They drained over 3 liters of fluid from my lungs which was very painful. My cardiac surgeon wanted to do a procedure to stop the fluid which would put me back in the hospital and leave me with a three inch scar on my side. I saw him on Monday, February 1st and the surgery was scheduled on Friday, February 5th. He wanted to see me the day before for x-rays. My prayer was; "Lord, I need a miracle, I don't want this surgery." The x-rays showed that the fluid was gone!



That was almost 5 months ago. Recovery is slow and I was told I wouldn't feel back to normal for at least a year. Praise God, I have been given permission to start playing golf again and to travel. I haven't been back to see the boys since October. I'm counting the days when I will return this summer!!

I have asked myself why me. I was perfectly healthy before all this. Through it all I have seen Him use this to heal relationships within our family. I was scheduled to fly to Haiti right after Christmas and if I had this

happen to me while I was there I'm sure I would not be alive today. God is good – all the time!

Thank you so much for your prayers. I never would have made it without them. The cards you sent were such an encouragement. They helped me get through rehab. It is such an awesome thing to know so many people are praying for you.
