Chairman's Corner

My name is Gary Gray and I have been on the Clear Lake Township board since 2004 and the Chairman since 2011. I would like to take a few moments to update you on some of the activities that the board is working on for you, the residents of Clear Lake Township. First, no issue in Clear Lake Township is more important than any other, no matter what the scope of the issue is. We are very approachable and hope that you will contact the township with any issue you feel needs to be addressed.

We are currently in the final stages of renegotiating the fire contract with the City of Clear Lake for fire protection and emergency medical services. This will better fit the dynamics of the fire department and save the township some money. Although not perfect, it is much better for all parties. We are also in the early stages of an orderly annexation with the City of Clear Lake which will protect the interest of Clear Lake Township property owners and the long-term future of the township.

For the past five years we have been planning for a new town hall which will help streamline our services and make us more efficient as a board. We were granted approval for the building of the new town hall at our annual meeting in March. We are also evaluating a fire department water fill station to help in the event of a large fire within the

township or city. Our main goal is to keep our 34 miles of roads in great shape for you and the safety of the traveling public. As you can see the township has a lot of moving parts and we try as a board to do what is fiscally proper for the township but at the same time provide high quality services for you the tax paying residents of Clear Lake Township.

New Electronic Poll Pad Sign-in

On election days, voters will use the new electronic sign-in pads:



The new wireless tablet-based system is designed to make it easier for *poll* workers to find voters' names and eliminate the waits that can happen when workers have to pore through printed binders arranged alphabetically.
