Blocking

This workshop provides comprehensive first-hand experience in blocking. Learn what tools are available as well as how to use blocking to enhance the look of your knitting. Learn how to block to size, as well as for effect.

Homework: Students must come to class with a knitted swatch 6 x 6", a yarn needle and a crochet hook. 10 students max: Beginner to advanced.

Now You Can Spin, What Next?

Now you can spin and make a great single, or a not so great single. In this class we will explore plying and more plying--such as Navajo plying, and cabled yarn which is actually more plying of the plying. We will also try our hand at core spinning and adding in 'stuff', to create really interesting yarns.

Students will need their own working spinning wheel, 2 bobbins, and a lazy kate Materials fee of \$15 will be paid directly to Jen at the time of the class.

Afternoon 1 pm – 4 pm Honeycomb Lace Scarf Learn to knit a Lace Scarf in a lovely overall honeycomb pattern, as well as how to start and finish with a simple lace edging. A lovely beginning lace project.
