Robert Houston Anderson

An American Soldier, Anderson was born October 1st, 1835 in Savannah, Georgia. After attending local schools in Savannah, Anderson received an appointment to the United States Military Academy at West Point. He would graduate in 1857.

After graduating from West Point and prior to the start of the Civil War, Anderson was posted to duty in upstate New York. He would later serve in the Washington Territory at Fort Walla Walla.



In 1861, just before the official secession of his home state of Georgia, Anderson received a commission in the Army of the Confederate States of America (ACSA) as a Lieutenant. He would be appointed to be Assistant Adjutant General to the Head of the Georgia Militia.

Anderson would see battle throughout the Civil War as part of the Georgia Militia and as part of the Tennessee Army. He would be promoted to Brigadier General in 1864 and would lead his Brigade against Union Forces during Sherman's March to the Sea. He would also participate in the Carolina Campaign prior to the collapse of the Confederacy in 1865.

After the war Anderson would become the Police Chief of Savannah. He is still honored by the police of Savannah to this day.

Anderson passed away on February 8th, 1888. Brother Anderson was member of Ancient Landmark Lodge No. 231 and the Eminent Commander of Palestine Commandery, Knights Templar No. 7 both in Savannah, Georgia. (http://www.masonrytoday.com/)

The Flaming or Wavy Sword in the 33° Emblem as a Symbol By ILLUSTRIOUS GEORGE L. MARSHALL, JR., 33°



The emblem of the 33° is a crowned double-headed eagle holding a sword in its talons. Although many renditions of the emblem show the sword as straight-bladed, historically it should have a wavy blade. Why is this?

We read in the Bible, (Genesis 3:24), English Standard Version: *He drove out the man, and at the east of the Garden of Eden he placed the cherubim and a flaming sword that turned every way to guard the way to the tree of life.*

To the Christian, the Tree of Life is symbolic of the promise of eternal life that believers have in Jesus Christ, that his Cross represents that Tree.

To the Jews, it is symbolic of wisdom. Proverbs 3:18 says, She is a tree of life to those who





embrace her; those who lay hold of her will be blessed.

First of all, we need to look at the word used for "Sword" in the original Hebrew. This word is *chereb* from the root word *charab*. The word *charab* can mean to "cut off and parch through a

drought." It can also mean "to desolate, destroy and kill." ⁶ The Hebrew word chereb means basically a tool usually a sharp edged one like a sword or knife, etc. that has a destructive effect.

The next word that we can examine a little closer is from the flaming part of the sword. It can be defined in the



original Hebrew as lahahh: "a supernatural weapon which could bring swift and deadly destruction." This word can also be defined as a fire, magic or enchantment that consumes, encircles or wraps up something.

Putting these two words together, you could create quite a few different graphic images of what was guarding the tree of life. When you look at it on the surface with all the fire, death, destruction, etc., you rather get the picture that someone would have to almost go through a living hell to get to the tree of life.

Putting a combination of these two words together to describe the "Flaming Sword" you could easily come up with the following interpretation: "Guarding every way to the Tree of Life--completely encircling it--is a supernatural being (cherubim) that makes use of powerful magic and enchantment to consume anything that tries to pass through the path it is guarding. Not only does it have the ability to deliver death, but utter destruction."



The French term *flamberge*, meaning "flame blade", is an undulating blade that is found on both long blades and rapiers. The term refers to the wavy blade which looks like a tongue of flame. When parrying with such a sword, unpleasant vibrations may be transmitted into the attacker's blade. These vibrations caused the blades to slow contact with each other because as additional friction was encountered with each wave. The unusual cross section of the blade would also inflict wider wounds with a thrust while still keeping the blade light.

According to Mackey, the Tyler's sword should traditionally be one with a "wavy" blade, to symbolize the flaming sword that was placed at the east of the garden of Eden, which turned every way to keep the way of the tree of life (Genesis 3:24). It should also never be sheathed, as it is the Tyler's duty to

keep off, always, "cowans and eavesdroppers."

As applied to the 33°, the flaming or wavy sword may be symbolically interpreted as follows:

- The 33°, besides being the highest degree of the Scottish Rite, is also an administrative degree. Those who attain it must guard tenaciously the established government, customs, and usages of the Rite.
- Those holding this degree have received the full knowledge of the Rite. Thus, the sword acquires the meaning of spiritual power and a source from which all science emanates.
- The holder of the 33° is responsible for radiating the light that is emitted by the blade of the sword with its zigzag reflections
 over all the members of the Rite. This light which is emitted by the flame-bladed sword must reach all the corners of the world
 thereby spreading wisdom to oppose dogmatism and hypocrisy.
- There is an implication in ritualistic pursuits, of the attainment of a return to (attain) that state . . that Unity with our Creator . . . in which we were before the 'fall from grace' in the Garden of Eden.

Thus, we see that the wavy sword, far from being just a mere addition to the 33° emblem, is susceptible of several symbolic interpretations which make it uniquely applicable to the status and responsibilities of a Sovereign Grand Inspector General. **GODSPEED**.

XIV. GRAND ELECT, PERFECT, AND SUBLIME MASON. Perfect Elu



It is for each individual Mason to discover the secret of Masonry, by reflection upon its symbols and a wise consideration and analysis of what is said and done in the work. Masonry does not inculcate her truths. She states them, once and briefly; or hints them, perhaps, darkly; or interposes a cloud between them and eyes that would be dazzled by them. "Seek, and ye shall find," knowledge and the truth.



The practical object of Masonry is the physical and moral amelioration and the intellectual and spiritual improvement of individuals and society. Neither can be

affected, except by the dissemination of truth. It is falsehood in doctrines and fallacy in principles, to which most of the miseries of men and the misfortunes of nations are owing. Public opinion is rarely right on any point; and there are and always will be important truths to be substituted in that opinion in the place of many errors and absurd and injurious prejudices. There are few truths that public opinion has not at some time hated and persecuted as heresies; and few errors that have not at some time seemed to it truths radiant from the immediate presence of God. There are moral maladies, also, of man and society, the treatment of which requires not only boldness, but also, and more, prudence and discretion; since they are more the fruit of false and pernicious doctrines, moral, political, and religious, than of vicious inclinations.

Much of the Masonic secret manifests itself, without speech revealing it, to him who even partially comprehends all the Degrees in proportion as he receives them; and particularly to those who advance to the highest Degrees of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite. That Rite raises a corner of the veil, even in the Degree of Apprentice; for it there declares that Masonry is a worship.

Masonry labors to improve the social order by enlightening men's minds, warming their hearts with the love of the good, inspiring them with the great principle of human fraternity, and requiring of its disciples that their language and actions shall con-form to that principle, that they shall enlighten each other, control their passions, abhor vice, and pity the vicious man as one afflicted with a deplorable malady. <u>http://freemasoninformation.com/masonic-education/books/morals-and-dogma/grand-elect-perfect-and-sublime-maso</u>


