She will present a history of group projects she's experienced at other guilds (Bees...take note!) and will also present her ideas of scrap piece projects that you can FINISH. You will enjoy Corrine's brand of cheer, and walk away with some great inspirations for projects.



Upcoming workshops for your education!! We have two visiting lecturers who will be giving us workshops in March and April, which will both follow our Day meeting into the afternoon.

- March brings Penni Domikis (Cabin In The Woods Quilters Fredericksburg), who will be teaching a pattern called "Pickle Dish" (see photo) that includes paper piecing and curved piecing using a Nested Petal Curve template that will be included with the toolkit (class \$40, includes the kit 2 templates and pattern). More info what fabrics to bring as we get closer. The workshop will follow our March 8th meeting, at 1-4, in the Courthouse Way Community Center.
- In April, we have an exciting unique quilting experience

   to make a Barn Quilt. Suzi Parron, who travels the country presenting the amazing community Barn Quilt Trails (8-foot square wooden quilt blocks on multiple barns), will park her RV here for a day and give us a lecture and then a workshop to make your own 2-foot square wooden barn quilt. (class is \$45, includes supplied prepared wood pieces and paints). The workshop will be at Grafton Christian Church, after our meeting April 12th at 1:30 4:30ish.

- Gala welcomed members to our new location. She thanked everyone that helped her search for our new location at Riverside Warwick Conference Center, 12420 Warwick Blvd., NN. There is no cost for the use of the building. She thanked Linda, Isobel and Karen for helping her set up. We will need to put the room back in the original set up at the end of the meeting. Any members that can arrive early and stay later, we appreciate your help with this task.
- Mark Sherman will be our speaker at the October meeting.
- Don't forget to sign up for the 2019 Challenge, "All Creatures Great and Small".
- The 2018 Challenge quilts will be displayed at the 2019 Mid-Atlantic Quilt Festival.
- Our raffle quilt made by Sandy Barnes' bee will be ready soon.
- Janice Pope will be our speaker at the day meeting this Friday, her topic is "Great Finishes".

#### **ANNOUNCEMENTS:**

- Honor Quilts—Terri McHenry-The guild will need a new chairperson as Terri will end her term in June. In 2018 our guild has completed 25 quilts ready for distribution; we have 13 that need to be longarmed; five tops that need backs and we have completed 67 quilts in 2018. Altogether, our guild has produced 1,133 quilts for service men and women and first responders.
- Monthly Mini—Joy Duke-Today we have a fabric basket donated by Barbara Linde, two zippered pouches donated by Denise Vassar and a plastic box with goodies inside donated by Gail Lockhart.
- Workshops—Cathy Fowler-We had a color class on Jan 8 taught by Kitty Tully. Feb 12 there will be a selvage edge class by Donna Dooley (supply list on the web site); and May 11, a class by Lee Taylor, this is an all day Saturday class; the cost will be \$20 plus a kit fee.
- Service Projects—Kim Beatley-This year our guild voted to primarily work on items for CHKD and Riverside Hospital. Please continue to make fabric hearts, baby quilts, bereavement quilts, lap quilts. She has 21 pillow cases made for children with cancer at MCV in Richmond. They will be taken to the Blue Crab Quilt, Co. this week.
- 2019 Challenge—Rhonda Gianturco-"All Creatures Great and Small" is the theme. The quilt should have some reference to animals, be 60x60 or smaller, with a label and sleeve. The fee to participate is \$2. Quilts will be due on Friday, November 8. There will be 1st, 2nd, 3rd and honorable mention ribbons.
- **BOM**—Denise Vassar-"Tilted Sampler" is our BOM this year. Two blocks will be issued each month. If you complete the quilt following the pattern, it will be 84 x 100. There will be two drawings each month for gifts (one of each completed block), and a grand drawing at the end of the year for the completed quilt. If you cannot attend the meeting with your completed block, Denise will add your name to the drawing if you email a photo of your completed block(s) to her before the meeting. Blocks do not have to be 'tilted' in the completed quilt, it is your quilt, design it as you would like.
- **Dog Kennel Quilts**—Isobel Meekins-Isobel recently received a thank you note from Chico Animal Shelter for sending 31 dog kennel quilts to their facility.
- **Symposium 2020**—Linda Odell-Symposium will be held on Saturday, April 18, 2020 at Hilton Baptist Church. Send any ideas, suggestions, volunteer requests to Linda. Don't forget to look at the web site for more information.
