TODAY'S MIRACLE

One interpretation of the Gospel of the multiplication of the loaves is that of Jesus inspiring the people to share the food which they had with one another so that all had enough to eat. In seeing it in this way we might miss an opportunity to emphasise God's continual blessing of us with abundance, with the risk of missing the most important blessing of all: ETERNAL LIFE. By focusing on the miracle of God's self-revelation through Jesus we are invited to place God's abundant gifts in the larger context of divine life that is already ours and will be ours one day in fullness. Two elements of the Gospel point to this interpretation: the actions of Jesus (TAKE, BLESS, BREAK, GIVE) parallel the actions that we do at the eucharist and the twelve baskets of fragments left over both point to the messianic banquet and eternal life. *Living Liturgy*

PLEASE BE AWARE

<u>It is essential</u> to be at the church <u>15 minutes</u> before mass starts, so that a steward can show you where to sit.

<u>Please enter</u> the church in the normal way and <u>exit</u> through the double doors at the rear of the church.

Important: Please <u>sanitise</u> your hands on entry into the church. Refrain from touching anything in the porch.

<u>There</u> will be no missals or hymn books and therefore no congregational singing during mass.

There will be no sign of peace.

Kneelers in the pews should not be used.

<u>Receiving Communion:</u> Please remain seated until directed by a steward to proceed. <u>Communion</u> can only be taken in the hand with your arms outstretched to the full so that there is the required distance between you and the priest.

Important: <u>At Communion</u> after the response: 'Lord I am not worthy....' the priest will hold up the Host to the congregation and say "THE BODY OF CHRIST" to which the people respond "AMEN". In the same way the people say "AMEN" after he has elevated the Chalice. This enables the people's Communion to be distributed in silence with no dialogue, as they have already acclaimed the presence of the Lord.

<u>There</u> will be <u>collection baskets</u> for Offertory Collection at the entrance and exit from the church.

<u>Please</u> disperse as quickly as possible after mass.

FURTHER INSTRUCTIONS

Those attending Mass/ Services in Churches should limit their interactions with anyone they are not attending church with, i.e. if they are attending corporate worship with one other household, wherever possible they should maintain social distancing with anyone outside of this group.

Face Coverings

Face coverings are currently mandatory on public transport and are mandatory in shops and in supermarkets. People are also strongly encouraged to wear face coverings in enclosed public spaces where there are people they do not normally meet, such as a church.

St. John Vianney

St. John Baptist Mary Vianney (1786-1859) was born in Dardilly and died in Ars, France. Although his talents were limited and his education meagre, he was ordained a priest in 1815. After three years at Ecully, he was appointed parish priest of Ars. Here he spent almost forty-two years of his life, devoting himself to prayer, mortification, and pastoral works. His success in directing souls made him known throughout the Christian world. Men of all ranks and conditions of life sought his guidance and advice. He was beatified by Pope St. Pius X, himself once a parish priest, and canonized by Pope Pius XI.
