

Guild continues to Serve Community

Five lap quilts were turned in at the November meetings and three were made from the large fabric donation from Janet Baker. The five lap quilts were delivered to Riverside Hospital for patients receiving cancer treatment at the Peninsula Cancer Institute. Our total delivered for the year is seventy five. Please bring in any lap quilts you have to the December meetings. I think we can make it to one hundred. December is the last month to have a chance to win a prize by returning a quilt from a kit. Lois Bates. Delores Thomas, Pat McGough and Joyce McKeel all won prizes. We might have double winners in December, too. Most of

the kits were signed out. I do have six quilt tops with backs that need quilted if anyone is interested in



practicing your machine quilting. Five small comfort quilts for babies, forty fabric hearts, two isolette covers and six

bereavement quilts were turned in, also. Three comfort quilts were from the kits. We have given out over 350 fabric hearts to NICUs this year. Thank you for supporting Small Service Projects in the following ways: Lap quilts approximately 32" x 38" for cancer patients at Riverside Hospital. Small comfort quilts approximately 24" to 36" for babies in NICU at CHKD and Portsmouth Naval Hospital that get to go home but don't have a good prognosis. Approximately 26-inch square bereavement quilts are needed at CHKD. Please use muted and pastel colors for these quilts that are appropriate for grieving parents. Fabric hearts for the parents of babies in NICU at CHKD, Portsmouth and **Riverside Hospitals.** The fabric hearts have been very popular and it is a good way to use left over fabric. The pattern is on the website under Service Projects. You can use cotton or flannel or both.

- Isobel Meekins announced for the day coordinator Linda Odell that the December Program would include the following for those who would like to


Door prizes were given out by Sandra Combs.


