#### **Ministry Notes**

As I write this, things continue changing. It remains a difficult time. And we all wonder where it's going. Truth is, we don't know and it's causing a lot of fear. There are two ways we can be affected by fear. We can be motivated to action, or we can be paralyzed to do nothing.

In the small catechism, Luther begins the explanation of each of the Ten Commandments by saying "We are to fear and love God." When Luther uses the word, "fear," he is talking about respect. Like the respect for a teacher or a coach. This kind of respect is given to someone because of an interpersonal relationship of trust and reverence.

This kind of fear is motivating, because we wish to do our best for a particular person. When we fear God, we not only have respect and reverence for God, we are motivated to do our best by loving God and loving our neighbor.

A second kind of fear is paralyzing. This has nothing to do with relationship and respect, but rather danger and mistrust. Rather than learning about something, we try to run away as fast as possible, only to experience our legs are like cement. This kind of fear causes us to curl-up on ourselves and consequently it makes matters worse.

As we deal with this Covid-19 virus, let's use our fear in a healthy way. Let's respect the leaders who are the experts, and let's learn about it... And when you think about it, that is exactly what we've

been doing. We've been learning about flattening the curve of infection through social distancing. And so, this healthy fear and respect have brought us to a place of taking action and for the purpose of loving our neighbor.

As we deal with this Covid-19 virus, let us resolve not to be so afraid that we become turned in on ourselves. Perhaps more than ever, we need to talk with each other and finds ways to listen and comfort one another. And I've been hearing stories of so many of you checking in with each other and helping one another out. This is a healthy response to fear; and it warms my heart to hear about it.

Easter is coming; resurrection is coming. It's exactly in times like these, that we need to be reminded of resurrection. Through the resurrection, we experience that, forgiveness is God's judgment. Resurrection is God's way of healing death and fear. And with that healing we learn to love and forgive others; it's a way of life.

Sure, we've been dealing with a lot in our country and community. Most of us have never seen anything like this. And yet, God is still in charge. The God we worship knows exactly what we're going through. The God we worship knows exactly what it's like to live in our skin. The God we worship knows what it's like to be afraid.

God never promised us an easy life; God promises to be with us through all things. And so, this too will pass. And I wonder how this experience will change us. Truthfully, I believe we will be stronger than ever. And thanks be to God.

nearly 1 in 11 Minnesotans experience food insecurity. We, at Cannon River, will be collecting food and cash donations. Checks can be made out to the Cannon Falls Food Shelf.

The food that was packed in November in Cannon Falls went to Haiti to an organization called Food for the Poor. It links the church of the First World with the church of the Third World in a manner that helps both the materially poor and the poor in spirit. 

Unsurprisingly, donations to Cross of Christ have dropped significantly in the last few weeks. Please see the section titled "Ways to Give to Cross of Christ" in this newsletter for more information on how to make a donation. The deadline to designate your 2019 Thrivent Choice Dollars has NOT been extended, it is still Tuesday, March 31. #### **PayPal**

If you use PayPal, you can easily send a donation to church. Here's how:

- \*Important\* Where it says "Paying for an item or service," Click "Change," and select "Sending to a friend." This lets us avoid any service fees.
- In the "Notes" section, please type your name and any specific fund you'd like. Click "Continue."

- Select the account or card you'd like to use (if you have more than one). Click "Next."
- Review the information for accuracy, and click "Send Payment Now."

# The Cross of Christ Christian College Scholarship Program



Purpose: The Cross of Christ Christian College Scholarship Program awards scholarships to members of Cross of Christ as a means to support furthering their education at a faithbased institution.

Scholarship Selection Committee: Three or more people will be appointed to serve on the scholarship selection committee each year. It is recommended that one person from the Church Council and two from the Learning and Youth Committee be considered. No family member of a scholarship candidate shall serve on the Scholarship Selection Committee.

**Criteria**: Students eligible for the scholarship must be active members of Cross of Christ for at least the previous 2 years and about to attend or attending a private 4-year Christian college or university. Students shall submit a scholarship application by the deadline, please contact the church secretary for the application. Applicants who are applying for their first year of college shall submit to the Selection Committee a copy of their high school transcript and must have a 3.0 grade point average.

**Guidelines:** Scholarships will be awarded on an annual basis and disbursed in equal payments in August and December payable to the institution being attended. Students must continue to attend classes and maintain at least a 2.75 grade-point average (or equivalent). Scholarship amounts will be recommended by the scholarship

selection committee to be approved by the church council at their first meeting following the recommendation by the scholarship selection committee. Students shall provide copies of their fall semester grade point average to the Selection Committee to continue to qualify for the December payment.

**Amount**: Each annual scholarship award will be based on funds available in the Cross of Christ Christian Scholarship Program and will be no more than \$1000 per student per school year.

**Deadline**: The application deadline is **May 15th**. The deadline is the date after which applications will no longer be accepted unless an exception is granted in advance by the scholarship selection committee.

**Renewal process**: Students are automatically considered for subsequent years' scholarships up to a maximum of 8 semesters (4 years) with evidence of attendance and a 2.75 grade-point average. Preference shall be given to first-year applicants over students who are renewing their application, if the fund will not support both.

#### How to make a face mask

Orders for standard/disposable masks are on long backorders, due to both demand and supply chain issues. Other hospitals across the country are reporting the same supply concerns.



While fabric masks are not to be used in the care of COVID-19 patients, according to the CDC, fabric masks are a crisis response option when other supplies have been exhausted. Fabric masks can also be helpful in other areas of patient care as supplies of PPE are depleted.

So the hospital is running VERY low on N95 masks. In the past, we would use

one mask per every patient we took care of. We are now using one mask for as long as we can, sometimes multiple shifts!

So in order for us to protect our N95 masks, we are using simple surgical masks and wearing them over our N95 masks. We are basically "double masking." If each employee has a mask that we can reuse to cover our N95, we can hopefully continue to keep ourselves safe.

Here is one link that has a video and some written instructions on how to make them. The material needs to be tightly woven cotton and able to be washed in HOT water. There are lots of different options out there. Since it's only protecting our other mask, it doesn't technically need a filter.
