"I urge, then, first of all, that requests, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for everyone— for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness." (1 Timothy 2:1, NIV)

The month of May is upon us and during this month are a number of important dates. Near the close of the month we have Memorial Day, towards the middle of the month is the day we honor mothers, but the first Thursday of the month of May has been designated since the 1950's as a National Day of Prayer.

This day many times has been hijacked by groups who have a special agenda. Many groups want you to pray for a certain cause, something they support and want you to join them in. And if you do find that you have strong ties to a certain cause – well then by all means you should pray to God to guide you to bring about change.



They provide encouragement, compassion, and other items the family may need.
