Road rage is described as any display of aggression by an operator of a motor vehicle.

In Ohio, there are approximately 8.7 million licensed drivers and identification card holders. With more drivers and vehicles sharing the roadways, the problem of aggressive driving continues to rise.

Are you an aggressive driver? If you do any of the following, you may be.

- ☐ Exceed the posted speed limit
- ☐ Follow too closely
- ☐ Pass on the berm
- ☐ Cut in and out of traffic
- ☐ Fail to signal multiple lane changes
- ☐ Violate posted railroad crossing signs
- ☐ Pass a stopped school bus
- ☐ Display or use a weapon
- ☐ Carelessly drive through construction zones
- ☐ Fail to yield at ramps and intersections
- ☐ Use more than one parking space
