Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

To all of my sister and brothers in Christ,

November is the month of Thanksgiving. In our country we have set the 4th Thursday of this month to be a day of thanks. And while the whole world does not celebrate Thanksgiving with us on this day, much of the world does set aside a day for the harvest. These harvest festivals held around the world are typically rooted in the theme of thanks during their celebrations. So one could say that much of the world does set aside a day to give thanks

Now our Thanksgiving holiday, while it has become more of a secular holiday, has its roots in religious traditions. And why not, if one thinks about it, if we are celebrating and giving thanks for the harvest and the bounty of the earth, then who would it be we are giving thanks too?

I guess that guestion is why I found this little piece written by Thomas Wentworth Higginson so intriguing. Mr. Higginson, an abolitionist who ministered in the Unitarian Tradition wrote these words: "An easy thing, O Power Divine,



To thank Thee for these gifts of Thine: For summer's sunshine, winter's snow. For hearts that kindle, thoughts that glow; But when shall I attain to this -To thank Thee for the things I miss?"

With these words Rev. Higginson has reminded us all how giving thanks for things like - family love, the necessities of life such as food and water, for the ability to reason, for the seasons of the year – while certainly important and necessary – are not the only things we should be celebrating thankfully.

If we do believe in a creator God then we also must consider those things we may find challenging or disconcerting. So while I am thankful and give praise to God for all the people of this church who give of their time and talents, who give generously to our mission and budget, and those who come to church faithfully; I am also reminded that I am to be thankful to God for those who disagree with me, those who critique me, and even those who dislike me. God presents me with these folks because by our coming together I am to continually grow and learn and strive to be better. And for that I am thankful!

In this day of division and disagreement both politically and religiously, maybe we are missing the point. We know and have certainly heard in church the last month how God's dominion is different from the world, how God does things differently than we might think. So maybe in this divisiveness we are to find some ways to be thankful to God in all of the things that we think on the surface are divisive. Maybe in our societal divisiveness we can find God working to show us how to be better, how to grow, how to learn and how to continually improve as disciples of Jesus Christ. And in doing so, maybe we can attain to this - thanking God for the things we miss this Thanksgiving.


