POPE FRANCIS

Dear Brothers and Sisters, Good morning and happy Sunday!

Today we are celebrating the feast of the Most Holy Trinity, which reminds us of the mystery of one God in three Persons: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The Trinity is the communion of Divine Persons who are one with the others, one for the others, one in the others: this communion is the life of God, the mystery of the love of the Living God. Jesus revealed this mystery to us. He spoke to us of God as the Father; He spoke to us of the Spirit; and He spoke to us of Himself as the Son of God. Thus He revealed this mystery to us. After He rose, He sent the disciples to evangelize to the peoples, He told them to baptize them "in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Mt 28:19). This command is entrusted by Christ in all ages to the Church, which has inherited the missionary mandate from the Apostles. He also directs it to each one of us who, through the power of Baptism, are part of his Community.

Therefore, today's liturgical solemnity, while making us contemplate the amazing mystery from which we come and toward which we are going, renews for us the mission of living in communion with God and living in communion among ourselves on the model of the divine communion. We are called to live not as one without the others, above or against the others, but one *with* the others, *for* the others, and *in* the others. This means to accept and witness in harmony the beauty of the Gospel; experiencing love for one another and for all, sharing joy and suffering, learning to ask and grant forgiveness, appreciating various charisms under the guidance of Pastors. In a word, we have been entrusted with the task of edifying *ecclesial communities which increasingly become families*, capable of reflecting the splendor of the Trinity and evangelizing not only with the words but with the power of the love of God that lives within us.

The Trinity, as I said, is also *the ultimate goal toward which our earthly pilgrimage is directed*. The journey of Christian life is indeed essentially a "Trinitarian" journey: the Holy Spirit guides us to full knowledge of Christ's teachings, and also reminds us what Jesus taught us. Jesus, in turn, came into the world to make the Father known to us, to guide us to Him, to reconcile us with Him. Everything in Christian life revolves around the Mystery of the Trinity and is fulfilled according to this infinite mystery. Therefore, we seek to always hold high the "tone" of our life, remembering *what goal, what glory* we exist for, work for, struggle for, suffer for; and what immense reward we are called to. This mystery embraces our entire life and our entire Christian being. We remember it, for example, each time we make the sign of the Cross: in the name of the Father, of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. And now I invite you, all together, and out loud, to make this sign of the Cross: "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit!".

Let us entrust ourselves to the Virgin Mary. May she who, more than any other being, knew, worshiped, loved the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity, lead us by the hand; help us to grasp in the world's events the signs of the presence of God, the Father and Son and Holy Spirit; enable us to love the Lord Jesus with all our heart, to walk toward the vision of the Trinity, the marvelous destination toward which our life is drawn. Let us also ask her to help the Church to be the mystery of communion and hospitable community, where all persons, especially the poor and the marginalized, may find welcome and feel themselves the wanted and beloved children of God.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas, ¡buenos días y feliz domingo!

Hoy celebramos la fiesta de la Santísima Trinidad, que nos recuerda el misterio de un Dios en tres personas: el Padre, el Hijo y el Espíritu Santo. La Trinidad es la comunión de las personas divinas que son una con las otras, una para las otras, una en las otras: esta comunión es la vida de Dios, el misterio del amor del Dios vivo. Jesús nos reveló este misterio. Nos habló de Dios como el Padre; Él nos habló del Espíritu; y nos habló de sí mismo como el Hijo de Dios. Así nos reveló este misterio. Después de que resucitó, envió a los discípulos a evangelizar a los pueblos, les dijo que los bautizaran "en el nombre del Padre, y del Hijo, y del Espíritu Santo" (Mt 28:19). Este mandato es confiado por Cristo en todas las épocas a la Iglesia, que ha heredado el mandato misionero de los Apóstoles. También lo dirige a cada uno de nosotros que, a través del poder del bautismo, somos parte de su comunidad.

Por lo tanto, la solemnidad litúrgica de hoy, al tiempo que nos hace contemplar el asombroso misterio del que venimos y hacia el que vamos, nos renueva la misión de vivir en comunión con Dios y vivir en comunión entre nosotros según el modelo de la comunión divina. Estamos llamados a vivir no como uno sin los demás, por encima o en contra de los demás, sino uno con los demás, para los demás y en los demás. Esto significa aceptar y presenciar en armonía la belleza del Evangelio; experimentando amor el uno por el otro y para todos, compartiendo alegría y sufrimiento, aprendiendo a pedir y otorgar perdón, apreciando varios carismas bajo la guía de los pastores. En una palabra, se nos ha encomendado la tarea de edificar comunidades eclesiales que se convierten cada vez más en familias, capaces de reflejar el esplendor de la Trinidad y evangelizar no solo con las palabras, sino también con el poder del amor de Dios que vive dentro de nosotros.

La Trinidad, como dije, es también el objetivo final hacia el cual se dirige nuestra peregrinación terrenal. El viaje de la vida cristiana es, de hecho, esencialmente un viaje "trinitario": el Espíritu Santo nos guía al pleno conocimiento de las enseñanzas de Cristo, y también nos recuerda lo que Jesús nos enseñó. Jesús, a su vez, vino al mundo para darnos a conocer al Padre, para guiarnos hacia Él, para reconciliarnos con Él. Todo en la vida cristiana gira en torno al Misterio de la Trinidad y se cumple de acuerdo con este misterio infinito. Por lo tanto, buscamos mantener siempre en alto el "tono" de nuestra vida, recordando para qué objetivo, para qué gloria existimos, trabajamos, luchamos, sufrimos; y a qué inmensa recompensa estamos llamados. Este misterio abarca toda nuestra vida y todo nuestro ser cristiano. Lo recordamos, por ejemplo, cada vez que hacemos la señal de la Cruz: en el nombre del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo. Y ahora los invito, todos juntos y en voz alta, a hacer esta señal de la Cruz: "¡En el nombre del Padre, y del Hijo, y del Espíritu Santo!".

Encomendemos a la Virgen María. Que ella, que más que cualquier otro ser, concierne, adorara, amara el misterio de la Santísima Trinidad, nos guie de la mano; ayúdanos a captar en los eventos del mundo los signos de la presencia de Dios, el Padre, el Hijo y el Espíritu Santo; capacítanos para amar al Señor Jesús con todo nuestro corazón, para caminar hacia la visión de la Trinidad, el maravilloso destino hacia el cual se dirige nuestra vida. Pidámosle también que ayude a la Iglesia a ser el misterio de la comunión y la comunidad hospitalaria, donde todas las personas, especialmente los pobres y los marginados, pueden ser bienvenidos y sentirse amados y queridos hijos de Dios.

Queridos irmãos e irmãs, bom dia e feliz domingo!

Hoje celebramos a festa da Santíssima Trindade, que nos lembra o mistério de um Deus em três pessoas: o Pai, o Filho e o Espírito Santo. A Trindade é a comunhão das Pessoas Divinas que são uma com as outras, uma pelas outras, uma pelas outras: essa comunhão é a vida de Deus, o mistério do amor do Deus Vivo. Jesus revelou esse mistério para nós. Ele falou conosco de Deus como o Pai; Ele nos falou do Espírito; e Ele falou conosco como o Filho de Deus. Assim, Ele revelou esse mistério para nós. Depois que Ele ressuscitou, enviou os discípulos para evangelizar aos povos, Ele lhes disse que os batizasse "em nome do Pai e do Filho e do Espírito Santo" (Mt 28:19). Esse mandamento é confiado por Cristo em todas as épocas à Igreja, que herdou o mandato missionário dos apóstolos. Ele também o dirige a cada um de nós que, pelo poder do batismo, fazemos parte de sua comunidade.

Portanto, a solenidade litúrgica de hoje, enquanto nos faz contemplar o incrível mistério do qual viemos e para o qual estamos indo, renova para nós a missão de viver em comunhão com Deus e viver em comunhão entre nós no modelo da comunhão divina. Somos chamados a viver não como um sem os outros, acima ou contra os outros, mas um com os outros, pelos outros e nos outros. Isso significa aceitar e testemunhar em harmonia a beleza do Evangelho; experimentando amor um pelo outro e por todos, compartilhando alegria e sofrimento, aprendendo a pedir e conceder perdão, apreciando vários carismas sob a orientação dos pastores. Em uma palavra, nos foi confiada a tarefa de edificar comunidades eclesiás que se tornam cada vez mais famílias, capazes de refletir o esplendor da Trindade e evangelizar não apenas com as palavras, mas com o poder do amor de Deus que vive em nós.

A Trindade, como eu disse, também é o objetivo final para o qual nossa peregrinação terrestre é direcionada. A jornada da vida cristã é de fato essencialmente uma jornada "trinitária": o Espírito Santo nos guia ao pleno conhecimento dos ensinamentos de Cristo e também nos lembra o que Jesus nos ensinou. Jesus, por sua vez, veio ao mundo para nos dar a conhecer o Pai, nos guiar a Ele, nos reconciliar com Ele. Tudo na vida cristã gira em torno do Mistério da Trindade e é cumprido de acordo com esse misterio infinito. Portanto, procuramos sempre manter elevado o "tom" de nossa vida, lembrando para qual objetivo, para que glória existimos, para que trabalhamos, para que lutamos, para que soframos; e a que imensa recompensa somos chamados. Esse mistério abrange toda a nossa vida e todo o nosso ser cristão. Lembramos, por exemplo, cada vez que fazemos o sinal da cruz: em nome do Pai, do Filho e do Espírito Santo. E agora eu convido vocês, todos juntos, e em voz alta, a fazer este sinal da cruz: "Em nome do Pai e do Filho e do Espírito Santo!".

Confiamos-nos à Virgem Maria. Que ela, que mais do que qualquer outro ser, conheceu, adorou, amou o mistério da Santíssima Trindade, nos guie pela mão; ajude-nos a compreender nos eventos do mundo os sinais da presença de Deus, o Pai, o Filho e o Espírito Santo; capacita-nos a amar o Senhor Jesus de todo o coração, a caminhar em direção à visão da Trindade, o maravilhoso destino para o qual nossa vida é atraída. Peçamos também a ela que ajude a Igreja a ser o mistério da comunhão e da comunidade hospitalária, onde todas as pessoas, especialmente os pobres e os marginalizados, podem encontrar boas-vindas e sentir-se os filhos queridos e amados de Deus.

Archdiocese of Newark announces phased reopening of churches

Beginning on Sunday, May 17, 2020, Phase One reopened churches in the Archdiocese **for private prayer only**, following all public health guidelines and once pastors determine they can safely do so. As part of Phase One, the Sacrament of Reconciliation also may be celebrated if social distancing can be maintained and masks are worn.

- Cardinal Tobin continues to dispense the faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday as well as from “Easter duty” (the obligation to receive Holy Communion during the season of Easter).
- Churches may be opened solely for personal prayer during limited and designated hours. Individuals and families may enter the church for quiet prayer only. During opening hours, a parish staff member must be physically present in the church to ensure social distancing and sanitizing. No gatherings are permitted.
- In accordance with national, state, and local health directives, those who show symptoms of COVID-19 or who have been exposed to an infected person are not permitted to enter the church for 14 days.
- In accordance with national, state, and local health directives, those who show symptoms of COVID-19 or who have been exposed to an infected person are not permitted to enter the church for 14 days

The specific details of when public Mass will resume and how it will be celebrated are still being determined, but the return will occur through a three-phase gradual process. **Each phase will be rolled out with specific dates and directives to follow determined by Archdiocesan leaders.**

Phase 1. Churches will first be opened for personal prayer only. Individuals and families can come to church for quiet prayer, and the Sacrament of Reconciliation may be celebrated if social distancing can be maintained and masks are worn.

Phase 2. Following on Phase 1, churches will be permitted to celebrate public weekday Masses and funerals with very specific restrictions, such as the strict practice of social distancing, use of masks and limited number of people present.

Phase 3. Following Phase 1 and 2, churches will be permitted to celebrate Sunday Mass publicly with the obligatory practice of social distancing, use of masks and limited number of people present. All other sacraments will resume according to the directives during Phase 3.
