#### President's letter - April 2014

Now that April has arrived, perhaps the weather gods will allow the temperature to start reflecting the fact that spring should be here!

AHAN held the annual spring meeting in Waterloo on April 6. Interested parties that attended were kept abreast of the activities surrounding the GPAC show in May. Entries are due April 24. Remember, there is no post entries allowed for dressage, with the exception of qualifying rides on May 8th for the Region 6 championship classes on the 9th. Also, there is a deadline prior to the start of the show to enter the AATR classes with \$10,000 in jackpots, so don't be left out of the money!

There has been some concern with the recent outbreak of EHV-1 in Minnesota (7 horses), Wisconsin (1 confirmed, 1 suspect horse), and Iowa (1 horse) about how this may affect our show and travel to other shows in the region. There is plenty of information available on the web about treatment protocol and isolation of actively infected horses.

The first line of prevention is, of course, vaccination. However, the vaccine can decrease the severity and duration of the disease, but not totally prevent it. One of the first signs of the disease is an elevated temperature, lack of appetite and nasal discharge.

Unfortunately, that is also indicative of many other upper respiratory diseases. It would be beneficial to have a baseline temperature for your horse/s so that any variation could be spotted ASAP. When exposed to UV light on a dry surface, the virus dies within hours. However, in a moist, dark protected environment it could possibly survive for up to one month.

Also good sanitary measures could be implemented. A 10% bleach solution is effective against this virus (and many others), inexpensive and can easily be used to disinfect stalls, grooming utensils, etc. Most disinfectants will kill the virus immediately.

I would encourage use of this procedure while attending shows in our area. Also check with the facility that you are traveling to in regards to what policies are in place to decrease transmission.

I look forward to seeing and visiting with everyone as our midwest show season gets underway. Good Luck to you all!

#### MINUTES FROM MARCH 4, 2014, AHAN BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

**MINUTES:** Julie K. presented the minutes of the Jan. 7, 2014, meeting. Shellee moved to approve the minutes and Carrie seconded. Motion passed.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** Julie D. reported that as of March 4, 2014, AHAN had \$41,707.49 cash on hand, with total assets and liabilities of \$42,258.03. Julie K. moved to approve the treasurer's report and Tom seconded. Motion passed.

**MEMBERSHIP:** Julie K. reported that as of March 4, 2014, AHAN had 68 adult members, 5 life and 22 youth.

SHOWS: GPAC – Show secretary DeAnne Allen reported that Nancy Porter of Minnesota had been hired to judge the Region 6 Off-Site Sport Horse Championships to be held May 9 at the LEC. No post entries will be accepted for dressage classes, with a caveat that AHAN reserves the right to limit the number of dressage rides. Judy Krohn will be the GPAC show announcer, Dale Liston the farrier, Tyce Lillenthal the ring steward and Tom Dasenbrock the barn manager. June Watkins is the USEF steward. The payback breakdown for the AATR jackpotted classes will be 60% to the winner, 30% to second and 10% to third.

**JAHAN:** Kandi reported that JAHAN held a membership meeting and the following board was elected: Emma Janiszewski president, Aiden Love vice-president, Hannah Rasmussen secretary/treasurer, with board members Shaylie Bussen, Colleen Savig and Revlin Rasmussen. JAHAN has many things planned for this year: An ice cream social Saturday at the GPAC show, a Chuck-A-Duck fundraiser, a basket silent auction. The JAHAN kids volunteered to help out at the GPAC show and plan to do a community service project for the Nebraska Humane Society. #### Arabian Horse Association of Nebraska membership application



The Arabian Horse Association of Nebraska (AHAN) Is a nonprofit organization dedicated to the promotion of the Arabian horse. Membership is open to all individuals and families with an interest in Arabians, whether or not they own an Arabian.

#### **VOTING MEMBERSHIP**

Adult: The first adult membership of any household (defined as the same address) is \$55. Each additional adult membership from the same household is \$45. All such members will have the rights and privileges pertaining to voting members, except that only one newsletter will be sent to each household. Families should bear in mind that only the person who joins will be eligible to participate in AHAN and AHA (Arabian Horse Association) activities. Voting membership includes membership in AHA, one vote, directory listing, monthly newsletter and eligibility for AHAN programs.

#### **NONVOTING MEMBERSHIPS**

Youth: For youth under the age of 18 as of Dec. 1. Includes a directory listing, monthly newsletter, AHA youth membership and eligibility for all AHAN and JAHAN programs.

**Associate:** For those who are not an AHA affiliate through AHAN. They have no voting rights and are not eligible to hold office or be a delegate. Associate members are eligible for all AHAN programs, including High Point.

Membership is 12 months from date of application.

Dues are due before the end of the last day of the month in which membership expires.
