

# NOTES FROM FR. VANDEWALLE

**Note about dinner.** Thanks to all, including Jim and Jen Woita who have been chairing the event for time immemorial (well as long as I've been here). Thanking them graciously for their great service as they retire this year from their position as chair people for the Bazaar. After the bazaar, as I was eating a delicious roll from the dinner, I was struck by the work that went into it and especially the many, many rolls (AND roles) it takes to provide for the dinner. Lots of work by the baker(s) and makers, very labor intensive. I thought of how good mothers over many years had been doing much labor and time intensive cooking and baking for their families, (in juxtaposition to my own not loving so much cooking or baking ... the microwave and quick eggs (vejce or vajec in Czech) in a skillet are my style). All the work that goes into the St. John's Bazaar or Touhy Soup Supper, and all our meals. Much time, effort, kneading, chopping, cutting, stirring that in the end yields a product of unity produced by many and inviting people from all over to come partake of the feast. This is a nice analogy to the People of God. God's people Israel through the ages were working imperfectly together doing God's work toward their own unity and the world. And God used them (like us) to prepare and invite others to His Feast! Each of us is also chosen to do his or her part in the working and the inviting.

**Bishop's Appeal for Vocations** – This year's theme is "Anointed to Preach the Good News" (Lk 4:18). Priests have been anointed to bear fruit, the abundant fruit of the kingdom. We give gratitude to God for the gift of His priests who give us God in the Sacraments and in the preaching of the Good News of Jesus Christ.

- We are blessed to have such a number of priests in our diocese which come from being seminarians.
- The expenses for the education of our seminarians (who pay a portion of their education themselves) is approximately \$1,500,000 for 2019-2020.
- Last year the BAV raised \$1,044,820 with a participation rate of 22%.
- The goal for diocesan parishes is \$800,000
- St. John's and St. Vitus' combined goal is \$8,580. (Parishes that support Catholic schools have a lower goal).
- If 50% of our 205 registered households gave (which may be wishful thinking), we could meet our goal if we averaged \$84.
- If 25% give (more likely) then a \$165 average would make our goal.
- I am grateful for any gift you can give toward this supernatural mission.
