Auxiliary Treasurers

Please review Booklet of Instructions; Auxiliary Treasurer, Duties of

At each Auxiliary meeting, the Treasurer shall make a report following the Reading of the Minutes, which shall contain:

- a) Balance on hand at last report This would include balance from previous month's report in each fund including General Fund, Dues, Relief Fund etc.
- b) Amount received from all sources since last report This would include all dues payments, life member fees, fundraiser proceeds, donations, etc. into each fund
- c) Amount expended since last report This would include all disbursements made from every fund
- d) Balance on hand This would be the ending balance in each fund.

Treasurer's report must show all receipts and disbursements in detail, including name of person or firm to whom check is issued and stating from what purpose.

While the Bylaws state that the report shall be presented in any manner determined by vote of the Auxiliary (Sec. 813A), I caution Treasurer's to make sure that the monthly report it clear and concise. Do not cut corners in presenting your report and be kind and respectful to members who have questions.

Deceased Members

Auxiliary Treasurers can mark members Deceased using MALTA. The first step is to MAKE SURE MEMBER IS REALLY DECEASED! Do not go off rumors.

Here are the steps:

- Log into MALTA
- Click on Duties
- Click on Auxiliary Treasurer
- Click on View Members
- Fill in Membership number or name of member
- Click on Search
- · Verify you are looking at correct member profile
- · Scroll to the bottom and check Deceased (fill if date if possible)
- Click SAVE
- Your screen will go back to the View Member screen and you'll member is now shown as Deceased.

All Members

See Bylaws Sec. 810A – The disbursement of money shall be upon motion made and passed at a meeting except for the transmittal of membership dues, which does not require a motion; expenses allowed by Standing Rules.

Solicitation of Donations either monetary or "in kind" must be approved by the Auxiliary membership. There have been instances when a member has requested donations on behalf of the Auxiliary for items such as car repairs, rent abatement, haircuts. I strongly suggest that every Auxiliary have a Standing Rule requiring any donation request to be on Auxiliary letterhead and signed by the President.

Records Retention

Auxiliaries must keep original Membership Applications for 6 years after a member dies or until the member attains the age of 120. There is nothing in the Bylaws to say that you must keep hard copy – you could scan them and save them on a flash drive.

Officers

There seems to be a lot of misunderstanding regarding officers' resignations and their right to run for the same office or another office. Any member who has been removed from office in accordance with Sec 809B shall not be eligible for election to that office during the current Auxiliary year. So, if an officer resigns because are moving and then decides not to move, may run for the same office or any other Auxiliary office.

Sec. 809B refers to officers that are removed for cause such as failure to fulfill the duties of their office. There is a procedure that must be followed. Those members once removed from office would not be eligible for election to THAT office during the current year. They would be eligible for election to any other office.

Help Stop the "Homelessness" in our Auxiliaries

Our Departments are already feeling the loss of Auxiliaries as Special Orders come from National Headquarters announcing Auxiliary closures. The closures may render our Auxiliary Brothers and Sisters "homeless"; that is without belonging to a working Auxiliary. How does this happen?

- Failure to elect and install officers for 2019-2020 per Sections 804A and 806A of the VFW Auxiliary Bylaws.
- Failure to hold regular meetings with a quorum present for transaction of business per Sections 210 and 212 of the VFW Auxiliary Bylaws.
- Cancelled by direct order of the VFW Commander-in-Chief. The VFW Auxiliary is dropped from the rolls of the National Organization due to the cancellation of a Post.

There are time constraints to see that members are relocated to a Healthy Auxiliary. If any one of the above examples is happening to your Auxiliary, please do take the initiative:

- To respond to letters from your Auxiliary or from your Department President or Secretary by letting the sender know what Auxiliary you will want to transfer into.
- Call on your fellow Auxiliary members to be sure they too will respond to communication, so they make their choice of the Auxiliary to transfer into.
- To not be "homeless"! Not responding and stating where you want to be transferred to will list you as a Member at Large in your Department.

• No Auxiliary home and family
 • No voice

- Not getting your service to veterans' volunteer time counted in the Department Programs
- While your membership stays on Department rolls, your Districts (if your Department has them) bear the burden of making up membership numbers from defunct Auxiliaries.

Your Auxiliary is not closing? Homelessness doesn't concern you or affect you? Why should you worry about "homeless" members?

- As an Auxiliary member, you should choose to concern yourself to bring members back into the fold, into your VFW Auxiliary home, into your Auxiliary family.
- By working the Member at Large list for your area, you are helping by being part of the solution!

CHIEF OF STAFF CONTINUED:

- Bringing in a Member at Large to your Auxiliary may help your membership numbers.
- It may give you another volunteer, or a new Chairman, or even a new Officer down the road.
- There are members (especially Life Members) on the Member at Large list that may not even realize their Auxiliary has folded.

As an Auxiliary member in good standing, you could keep the homeless numbers down. Here's how:

- Offer to be the team lead for the Member at Large project for your Auxiliary
- Recruit fellow members to contact those on the Member at Large list.
- No one needs to go at a task alone. Besides, it's a great time to get to know your Brothers and Sisters under different circumstances besides in a business meeting.
- Assist your Auxiliary by going through your Department Member at Large list.
- Have your Auxiliary format a letter inviting a Member at Large to join your VFW Auxiliary Family and give some examples of how your Auxiliary bring our National programs into the community, making a difference for our veterans and their families.
- Let them know the Department and National is under new leadership.
- · Let them know if the Auxiliary is under new leadership.
- Let them know some of the National Programs areas of emphasis and how this is the year of "Serving Our Veterans with Aloha!"
- Host a Family Freedom Festival to show them visually what the Programs mean to your Auxiliary and to our veterans.
- Have your Auxiliary host a "Welcome Back Night" of training for members from the Member at Large list to show them all the resources <u>MALTA</u> and the <u>National</u> <u>website</u> holds for us.

Let your Department Chief of Staff know that your Auxiliary is working this aspect of Extension. Work together with your Membership and Mentoring for Leadership Chairmen. Let me know if your Auxiliary has taken up the "homeless" cause.

September is Suicide Awareness month. If you have not already done so, now is a good time to get the Suicide prevention ACT cards, Warning signs of Suicide, Veterans Crisis Line (1.800.273.8255) and other materials displayed at the Post and make them accessible in your 'outreach' packets.

- Promote Veteran and Military Suicide Awareness and Prevention. An estimated 20 veterans a day commit suicide. You can help lower this number and make a difference in the life of a veteran or service member in crisis by educating yourself and others about the warning signs of suicide.
 - The <u>Veteran & Military Suicide Awareness Blue Teardrop Pin</u>: Auxiliaries are encouraged to purchase and wear the teardrop. When asked about the significance of the Tear Drop, share that it is to promote awareness for veteran and military suicide.
 - The <u>Veterans Crisis Line</u> connects veterans in crisis and their loved ones with qualified, caring Department of Veterans Affairs responders through a confidential toll-free hotline, online chat, or text. Veterans and their loved ones can call 1-800-273-8255 and Press 1; chat online; or send a text message to 838255 to receive confidential support 24 hours a day. Support for deaf and hard of hearing individuals is also available.

VFW AUXILIARY HOSPITAL GRANT APPLICATION

The purpose of this grant is to benefit veteran patients in VA Medical Centers, those utilizing VA Clinics, or residents of State Veterans' Homes, rehabilitation facilities or homeless programs sponsored by the VA. Other types of care facilities will be considered on a case by case basis. \$250.00 is the maximum amount that will be disbursed per Auxiliary per year. A "Project Completion Report" is requiredincluding receipts for total funds spent, pictures, volunteers and number of veterans served. That report must to be sent to the VFW Auxiliary Arizona Department Hospital Chairman immediately following the completion of the project / donation. Copies of the receipts for purchases are to be sent to the Department Treasurer.

Invite your national legislators to participate in a Town Hall meeting. Write a well thought out letter and encourage your family, friends, neighbors, and the guy on the street to write as well. Be VOCAL and PO-LITE! Make contact with your local newspapers, television and radio news for sharing the needs and ideas.

Talk with educators about inviting veterans to talk about their time in the military. Some will talk gladly while others may not. This could be a great history project for young people to inspire and to point them in a future career path. Partner with other organizations such as the League of Women Voters to assist high school seniors with the voter registration process. This will tie in with required graduation classes.

When we remain silent is when we fail! As citizens, we owe our veterans more than we can repay. Involvement is what it's all about.

Engage new members with a solid plan during their first year as an Auxiliary Member.

The first 3 months are the most critical to show a new member that they are valued and appreciated.

They just paid to donate their time and energy to our cause and should receive an orientation on programs and benefits and mentoring to help develop a feeling of commitment and belonging.

Be sure to utilize the New Member Orientation Checklist.

Within the First Week

Call or email the new member to introduce yourself. Offer your contact information should that new member have any questions. If your Auxiliary has a website or Facebook page, tell them about it so they can see what's going on. Provide a calendar of upcoming events.

Encourage them to create a member profile in MALTA.

Within the First Month

Invite the new member as soon as possible to whatever Auxiliary event is coming up next, whether it be a meeting, a community service project, or something else. Offer to pick them up if they need a ride. Or if it's a family event, be sure to let them know that anyone can come. They might feel more comfortable coming with a family member or friend. Be sure to send them a reminder at least three days out from the event. And immediately following the event, send an e-mail or handwritten note saying that you're glad they came.

Give them a New Member Packet with the items available on the national VFW Auxiliary website (www.vfwauxiliary.org).

Within the First Two Months

Your Auxiliary will most likely have a meeting within this time period. Specifically invite the new member and save them a seat. Have a copy of "Understanding VFW Auxiliary Traditions" printed out and make time to explain each of the items on it. Much of it will be entirely new to them.

Within the First Three Months

Scheduling is difficult, but try to meet up for coffee, and see if the new member has any questions about what they have been involved with so far. Have a copy of the VFW Auxiliary Bylaws and Ritual available in case a question comes up that you can't answer.

The goal with each of these steps is to maintain contact with the new member in order to engage them in your Auxiliary as soon as possible. Engaged members actively participate in Auxiliary meetings, events, special projects and leadership opportunities. Once you have engaged that member and extended that hand of friendship continues to nurture that relationship. An engaged membership equals a healthy Auxiliary!

Partner up Mentoring – Utilize the knowledge of an existing member by matching new members with them and having an orientation package with information about our traditions, officer contact info, upcoming events & programs.
