1. To change your life.

Jeremiah 29:11 (NIV) – "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and future."

2 Peter 3:9 (NIV) – "The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead He is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance"

Change is something we tend to fear and become anxious about, because we do not feel in control of life. The great news is that God has a plan for your life to hope for a future and to prosper. If we trust in God and allow the change to grow us to become more like Jesus Christ in how we respond and act, then we are promised that all things will work together for good for those who love Him and keep His commandments.

2. To impact others for the good.

Isaiah 43:19 (NIV) – "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland."

3. To change the world.

Hebrews 6:19 (NIV) – "We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure. It enters the inner sanctuary behind the curtain."

4. To develop other disciples for God. Who have you developed lately?

Hebrews 13:8 (NIV) - "Jesus Christ is the same vesterday and today and forever."
