Our Transformational Ministries continue doing good work during this time of quarantine

Outreach provided gift cards for the teachers and staff at RMS that were mailed to their home addresses. The teachers and staff continue to meet regularly as they work on remote learning for the RMS scholars.

St. Mark's has also made a handful of food bank deliveries for some RMS families who lack transportation with the help of Jon Rochester. Jon continues to touch base with use regarding ongoing needs.



Our Escuelita continues to make academic efforts, in the midst of these strange times.

The teachers have learned to host their classes on Zoom and are leading twice weekly meetings. We meet after each class to discuss, recommend and invite curriculum tweaks to work better with each group.

They are coaching parents on how to help make the sessions more fruitful and how to support learning between meetings.

For the students who have no access to these sessions, packets have been prepared to help students continue to work on basic Pre-K skills, letters, numbers, shapes, cutting, counting, and more.

We have the curriculum adaptations ready through May 15.

As further news develops, we will work out plans for the end of the year.

The children are, of course, thrilled to see their teachers. They miss us "almost" as much as we miss them.
