Faithful God

Isaiah 54: 4-10

5th July



Mountains are marvellous. Some of us want to admire their soaring majesty from the bottom. Others will want to climb to the top either to say we have done it or just because it is there. Still others will want it to be covered in deep snow and throw themselves off it at speed with two pieces of plastic strapped to their feet.

Psalm 121 (v.1&2) begins with the invitation to lift our eyes up to the mountains (translated as "hills" in some versions). Then the question is asked: *"Where does our help come from?"* Perhaps the author is thinking of a great army coming over the mountains to relieve a besieged city. Or just of the permanency of mountains or the beauty of their Creator reflected in them. The author of the Message translation adds the word "No" to the start of verse 2. Help does NOT come from the mountains but from the Maker of Heaven and Earth. The one who made the mountains. God is more constant, steadfast and dependable than the mountains.

Isaiah 54.10 says: *"For the mountains may depart and the hills be removed, but [God's] steadfast love shall not depart from you,"* Wow! What a promise to hold onto at times like this. The Covid-19 pandemic has rocked all our human structures.

The vulnerabilities of our financial system have once more been exposed. Mistakes have been made in how to contain and respond to this virus by governments. Loved ones have been taken too soon from us. And many of us have seen our worlds shrink to our homes and, if we have one, our gardens. We miss our family, seeing and touching others, and we miss being able to worship God in church. Things may never be the same again but there is one we can rely on to be more constant than the mountains.

In all this change and uncertainty, God is faithful. Since the days of Noah, God has promised not to wipe us out. He is not going to stop hard times but our faithful God will be with us through them. Just like a winter coat cannot change the weather, but changes how we feel about and cope with it, God is with us. He has made a *covenant*

of peace with us that shall not be removed (as is promised in the second part of Isaiah 54.10). He has compassion on us. He loves us.

As lockdown is eased, it is clear that this is not over. Having just about adapted to how things have been the last 3 months, we now move into the next normal. Let us hold onto our faithful God who never changes. May He bring us His peace and strength for whatever lies ahead. May He be more reliable than the mountains themselves for our hope is in our faithful God.
