Re: Application for a General Lines Life, Accident and Health Insurance License

Dear Mr. Morris:

According to Department records, it appears that you have had a previous license denied or revoked. Therefore, previous offer to issue a probated license is still under review.

In order to thoroughly evaluate your pending application for an insurance license, the Department requests that you provide the following information no later than **thirty (30) days** after your receipt of this letter:

- X A letter explaining: the circumstances which led to denial or revocation of your previous license(s); why you failed to disclose the denial or revocation of your previous license(s);
- X Evidence of your activities since the denial or revocation, especially evidence showing rehabilitation or rehabilitative effort;
- X A resume or letter providing your employment history for the past five (5) years;
- X A detailed description of your educational background, including the date any of the following were earned college degree, vocational degree, other advanced training, certification or license;
- X Letter(s) of recommendation from your current employer, previous employer(s) and/or prospective insurance employer;
- X Letter(s) of recommendation from persons who are aware of the denial or revocation of your previous insurance license;
 - Letter(s) of recommendation from prosecution, law enforcement, and correctional officers who prosecuted, arrested, or had some custodial control over you;
- X Written proof that restitution was paid pursuant to the previous Commissioner's Order;
 - Written proof that all outstanding court costs, supervision fees, fines, and restitution as may have been ordered in your criminal case have been paid in full;
- X Any other evidence in support of licensure you would like the Department to consider.

Because of the importance of the good cause evidence contemplated by TEX. INS. CODE ANN. § 4005.105(c), a hearing will not be scheduled in this matter until the items requested above have been received.
