Fortified, Refreshed, and Energized!

I am not certain when I first heard the term *revival*. As I was growing up, I do not recall ever having a guest preacher come to the Presbyterian church we attended to revive us in our desire to serve God. However, in my young adulthood, as I became affiliated with various Baptist churches, some of them would have revivals.

After obeying the gospel, I became acquainted with a different term, *gospel meeting*. The term signifies the exact purpose of the meetings – assemblies in which the gospel is preached with the hope that those outside the body of Christ will be influenced to believe and obey it. In the period between the end of the Civil War and the end of the war in Viet Nam, gospel meetings often lasted through three Sundays and perhaps through the third Wednesday, and may have included both day and evening services. These meetings were well attended and many souls were converted or restored to Christ. However, since the 1970's, gospel meetings have mostly been reduced to the Sunday-through-Wednesday or weekend format with only one service except on Sundays.

Why has interest in gospel meetings waned so much in recent years? I suggest that it is because of worldliness – the fact that so much of our time is occupied by worldly activities. In times past, gospel meetings were more popular because people were not so involved in TV, sports activities, and the pursuit of hobbies. Attending the meetings provided a great break in the routine of their lives. Today our society is so much more worldly-minded, and thus less spiritually minded. Instead of putting God first in our list of priorities, we manage to pencil Him in when there is a vacancy. When that becomes our habit, we soon find ourselves just going through the motions and in danger of falling away altogether. (Continued next page)
