Outdoor Worship: Beginning Sunday, July 19th, we will hold worship at 9:30am on the front lawn outside Luther Hall. Masks will be required, as well as physical distancing practices. Please bring a lawn chair. If you are unable, some chairs will be provided. Canopy tents are being ordered and shade will be available. Please see the third page of this insert for more information about worship practices.

Please call Tom Stockford-Shively (517-398-0773) or Christine McNamara (517-416-4713) to let us know that you'll be coming. This is not required, but will help us plan worship for the appropriate number of people.

The first week will be a Service of the Word so that we can get used to new worship practices. Beginning July 26th, we will celebrate Holy Communion weekly.

In the event of inclement weather, we will not gather in person for worship. The worship leaders will record the service, and it will be posted online on Sunday afternoon.

Stewardship: Even though the church buildings are closed, we still have expenses, and more importantly, God is still at work. We hope that you are able to continue your giving to the church during this time in order to give thanks for God's presence and support the ways that God continues to be at work through our ministries. Online giving is no longer available, however you may make your offering by mail, or by dropping your offering at the church. If you wish to sign up for automated giving from your bank account, please contact the church office.

Church Cleaning: During the pandemic, Tom is still working hard to keep our buildings clean and disinfected. He is following all CDC guidelines and best practices to keep food pantry volunteers, our secretary, and church members safe. The office and King's Kupboard are disinfected daily, and are in the process of being deep-cleaned for whenever we are able to return to church. However, the buildings remain closed, with the exception of the areas needed for the food pantry. Please do not enter the buildings at this time.

MODIFIED WORSHIP PRACTICES DUE TO COVID-19

In order to mitigate the risk of virus transmission within our worshipping community, our worship practices will be modified in the following ways:

General Practices:

- Masks must be worn in worship and on all church property for individuals over the age of 2. If you do not bring a mask of your own, a mask will be provided.
- Please do not make physical contact with anyone outside of your household, and maintain a 6-foot distance from others, including while walking in and out of buildings.
- Please remain in your seating area throughout the service as best as you are able.
- Please do not eat or drink during worship (except for children who may need a snack or drink). Worship leaders are permitted to bring water in a closed container.

Speaking and Hymns:

- Studies show increased risk of virus transmission through aerosol particles when singing or speaking loudly.
- When outdoors, singing will be limited in worship, and you are encouraged to sing only in a quiet voice.
- When participating in unison speaking during worship, please do so in a quiet voice.
- In the event that services move indoors, congregational singing will be omitted from the service, and a cantor will sing the hymns. Please do not sing along.

Holy Communion:

Communion will be celebrated at every Sunday service, beginning July 26, 2020.

- Altar Guild will prepare the elements before worship using masks and gloves.
- The elements will be distributed to members to take to their seats at the beginning of worship. Gluten free wafers and grape juice are available upon request.
- The elements of communion will be received by the congregation in their seats at the times directed by Pastor Hahn.

Thank you for helping keep one another safe and healthy!

If you become ill or come in contact with someone displaying symptoms of COVID-19:

- Self-isolate for 14 days.
- Contact Pastor Hahn as soon as possible so that church members may be notified (517-607-9429). If Pastor Hahn is not available, please call Christine McNamara (517-416-4713) or Tom Stockford-Shively (517-398-0773).
- In the event of a positive case or suspected case of COVID-19 at church, all those in attendance will be contacted asap.

According to the CDC, symptoms of COVID-19 may include:

Symptoms may not appear for 2-14 days after exposure to the virus, ranging from mild to severe symptoms. Some people may not display any symptoms at all.

The CDC and the State of Michigan continue to recommend that older adults and those with severe underlying medical conditions continue to shelter in place due to increased risk of severe illness. If you fall into one of these categories or are in regular contact with someone who does, please carefully consider when it is advisable for you to return to in-person worship.

Anyone that is uncomfortable returning to in-person worship at this time should not feel pressured to do so. We fully support your preference to remain at home while there is still risk and uncertainty associated with this deadly virus.
