### **2019 LEGISLATIVE RECAP**

The 2019 legislative session and special session have come to an end. Over the last few months we have been sending weekly email updates to brief you on what was happening at the Capitol. While the conclusion of this session was not what we had hoped for with regards to the provider tax, additional pieces of legislation were passed that will impact the profession.

#### MINNESOTA FIGHTS BACK AGAINST THE OPIOID CRISIS

Republicans and Democrats came together to pass a major bi-partisan piece of legislation known as the Opioid Stewardship Fund. This bill will raise \$20.9 million dollars per year through fees assessed on drug makers and distributors. The revenue raised will go toward treatment, education, and support for social service agencies that have been impacted by the crisis. The bill also established an advisory council that will make additional funding recommendations. The bill's authors, Rep. Olson (DFL-Duluth) and Sen. Rosen (R-Vernon Center), worked hard this session to get the bill to the Governor's desk by May 20.

#### **HOW THIS WILL IMPACT YOU:**

- Licensees with the authority to prescribe controlled substances must obtain at least two hours of continuing education hours on best practices in prescribing opioids and controlled substances, including nonpharmacological and implantable device alternatives for treatment of pain and ongoing management, as part of the continuing education requirements for licensure renewals. Licensees shall not be required to complete more than two credit hours of continuing education on best practices in prescribing opioids and controlled substances before this subdivision expires. This will expire in 2023.
- The legislature previously passed a bill that limited the prescribing quantity for controlled substances for dentists to a four-day supply for acute pain. New language was adopted to clarify that this limit also applies to acute pain associated with wisdom teeth extraction surgery.
- While the bill will require providers to check the prescription monitoring system, prescribers are not required to check the system if:
  - The prescription order is for a number of doses that is intended to last the patient five days or less and is not subject to a refill;
  - The prescription order is issued within 14 days following surgery or three days following oral surgery or follows the prescribing protocols established under section 256B.0638 of the Opioid Prescribing Improvement Program.

# **LEGISLATIVE RECAP** continued ... EXPANSION OF THE CLEAN INDOOR AIR ACT


Additional legislation adopted this year included adding electronic cigarettes in the definition of smoking under the Clean Indoor Air Act. The MDA has been vocal about the oral health dangers related to vaping.

#### PROTECTING ADULT DENTAL CARE

During negotiations, the Senate's proposal to cut adult dental benefits under Medical Assistance was removed from the final version of the bill.


#### **PROVIDER TAX**

The provider tax was reinstated at 1.8%, with no sunset. The new rate will take effect January 1, 2020. ■

# MDA'S ENTREPRENEURIAL DENTAL BOOTCAMP RECEIVES OUTSTANDING RESPONSE

Over the years the MDA has heard from many dental students and new dentists that they don't know much about the business end of dentistry and don't have the confidence to start up or purchase a dental practice. In the fall of 2017, the MDA created a taskforce to address this issue. The focus was to assist new dentists and dental students with the options available to them in the dental practice. Out of these meetings the committee agreed on the following:

- > Let the dental students and new dentists know that private practice is an option and they can do it.
- Educate dental students and new dentists on the advantages of owning a practice.
- Provide members with the tools they need to be successful in owning a practice.
- Be visible and available to the dental students and new dentists. Help them understand that they have a lot of options within dentistry and owning a practice is doable.
- Dental students get minimal amount of exposure regarding practice management while in dental school. Help them to understand that there are lawyers, accountants, real estate lawyers, contractors, and insurance companies who specialize in the dental profession and want them to be successful.

The first Entrepreneurial Boot Camp, held on May 18, was a huge success. The MDA worked closely with Hillary Harms Becchetti to set up a team of dental professionals willing to present on the following topics: general business operations, financing, regulatory compliance, and practice management.
