

# CHAT'N CHEW RECAP

RSBC women experienced yet another awesome and engaging time at Chat 'n Chew on Saturday, June 8, 2019.

As expected, our guest facilitator, Minister Liz Ligawa of Waco, Texas, challenged us to share openly and honestly in a courageous discussion as "women supporting women." She emphasized that we are all shaped by our experiences whatever they are—good, bad or indifferent. While most of us are eager to share positive experiences, we may find ourselves sweeping those traumatic experiences under the proverbial rug. Yet their influences touch so many areas of our lives to include self-image, relationships, communication, forming opinions of others, isolationism, work ethic and our ability to fulfill our God-ordained purpose, to name a few.

We discovered that 100% of the women in attendance could identify with a traumatic life experience, yet 100% (not even one) could report that she has sought help, such as counseling, therapy or a support group.



Recognition of the problem and its impact on our lives is a good starting point. With real mirrors in hand, each of us faced the music with these questions:

What do you see in the mirror?

What impact has your traumatic experience left on your life?

Minister Ligawa, known for enriching her message with props and practical illustrations, summarized answers to the aforementioned questions into the following categories:

Perhaps you have been masking as if everything is fine. Yet your life shares the characteristics of a **worn-out brake pad.** You are living with impending danger. It is just a matter of time before you crash.

How about a **flat tire**? Have you lost the very air or energy you need to rise up to take charge of your life and make decisions for yourself and others for whom you are responsible? It is time to get some help.

Could you possibly need **jumper cables** because you are 100% stalled out and need assistance to get back on the road? In fact, you might have the jumper cables but still need someone to assist with the correct placement of the red and black connectors. Failure to connect properly could cause you to blow up something. Reach out to someone.

That someone may need to be more than a BFF or your *sister girls*. Do not discount the value of assistance from a qualified professional, especially one who shares your faith. You should inquire through the church leadership for assistance with referrals.

Meanwhile, women must support each other with words of encouragement and intentionality. During lunch, each woman received positive affirmations to take home.

I strongly encourage you to invite a sister and join us for the next Chat 'n Chew—targeting women of all ages.

# **FIREWORKS SAFETY TIPS**

### **Leave Fireworks to the Professionals**

The best way to protect your family is to not use any fireworks at home. Instead, attend public fireworks displays and leave the lighting to the professionals.

If you plan to use fireworks, make sure they are legal in your area.

### **Be Extra Careful With Sparklers**

Little arms are too short to hold sparklers, which can heat up to 1,200 degrees. How about this? Let your young children use glow sticks instead. They can be just as fun but they don't burn at a temperature hot enough to melt glass.

Closely supervise children around fireworks at all times.

# **Take Necessary Precautions**

Do not wear loose clothing while using fire works.

Never light fireworks indoors or near dry grass.

Point fireworks away from homes and keep away from brush, leaves and flammable substances.

# Be Prepared for an Accident or Injury

Stand several feet away from lit fireworks. If a device does not go off, do not stand over it to investigate it. Put it out with water and dispose of it.

Always have a bucket of water and/or a fire extinguisher nearby. Know how to operate the fire extinguisher properly.

If a child is injured by fireworks, immediately go to a doctor or hospital. If an eye injury occurs, don't allow your child to touch or rub it, as this may cause even more damage.




