## *From the Pastor's Desk*

*"Rather, when you hold a banquet,  
invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind;  
blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you.  
For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."*

Dear brothers and sisters,

I was asking myself what that meant in my life and in the life of all of us parishioners at St. Francis de Sales. First question that came is, who are those poor? And the second is why them? To first question, have you ever noticed how life has crippled us many times through the wounds we suffered during our childhood or later in life. How hard is for us to trust and thus we are kind of lame, always with fear; or that we do not see where God is in certain events of our lives?. So the poor are us, we are the ones that have been invited to this banquet of the Eucharist. This banquet where Christ gives Himself to us so that we can have His life; this banquet that we cannot repay. To the second question, because he wanted to. God is not choosing us because of our merits, or abilities or greatness, but because he wanted to elect us in our poverty. This is the most difficult thing of Christianity, to accept to be loved without having merited or deserved it. It is an invitation to discover this, so that we can do this to others.



Also, this past week, we started with the project of resealing the Church exterior, repairing the Church doors and redoing the front entrance of the rectory. All these projects are financed through your generosity during the We Are the Living Stones campaign. Last summer we changed our statement of goal to the sound system and resealing of the Church exterior. Also, thanks to a loan from the Archdiocese that is taken from the Annual Appeal Campaign, we are moving to finish the parking lot as we have said before. Another thing that you might have noticed, we had to tear down the gazebo due to safety reasons. We are going to build a new one in the place where the previous one stood. Finally, during September we will restart CCD and most of our programs; I invite you to stay active in the faith and nurture your faith with the programs that we have and will have in our parish.

Dios no nos está eligiendo por nuestros méritos, habilidades o grandeza, sino porque quería elegirnos en nuestra pobreza. Esto es lo más difícil del cristianismo, aceptar ser amado sin haberlo merecido o merecido. Es una invitación a descubrir esto, para que podamos hacer esto a los demás.

Además, la semana pasada, comenzamos con el proyecto de volver a sellar el exterior de la Iglesia, reparar las puertas de la Iglesia y rehacer la entrada principal de la rectoría. Otra cosa que habrás notado es que tuvimos que derribar la glorieta por razones de seguridad. Vamos a construir uno nuevo en el lugar donde estaba el anterior. Finalmente, durante setiembre reiniciaremos CCD y la mayoría de nuestros programas; Los invito a mantenerse activos en la fe y nutrir su fe con los programas que tenemos y tendremos en nuestra parroquia.

Outra coisa que você deve ter notado: tivemos que derrubar o mirante por razões de segurança. Vamos construir um novo no local onde estava o anterior. Finalmente, durante setembro, reiniciaremos o CCD e a maioria de nossos programas; Convido você a permanecer ativo na fé e nutri-la com os programas que temos e que teremos em nossa paróquia.




