Day of Remembrance was on May 22 National Maritime Day

DID YOU KNOW?

..... that when the first call went out that WWII had started, Our country had to quickly get organized. In 1941, ships were the answer and had to haul every item needed to the war front. We hauled bombs, planes, tanks, fuel, food, Troops, and guns and every single item necessary to

care for our troops and fight the battle. Thousands of men, some too young, some too old, some with less than perfect bodies. willingly joined the service, by enlisting into the Merchant Marines. We stood and raised our right hand and took the exact same oath that every one of you took. We were then subject to the same Military discipline, including Court Marshal. We were trained by the Coast Guard at several locations across the country. I trained at Catalina Island off the coast of California. Later, my brother Bob did too, at the age of 15!

Approx 250,000 mariners manned these ships through the war, facing Japanese

submarines in the Pacific. And the German Wolf packs on the Atlantic. Later they began putting Navy Armed Guards on board with us. I was trained in weaponry when I got on board ship, and we all had gun stations. Mine was at a 5 inch gun on the fantail of the ship. I passed the ammunition. When the war ended, we mariners learned as we left the ships together with our shipmate Navy Armed Guards, that they went home to all VA benefits including the GI bill. We received nothing!. Only until 1988, 42 years later and then only after a million dollar law suit in a Federal court brought on by a couple of Merchant Mariner POW's were we given discharges (DD214 forms) but we were too late for most benefits.

General Douglas McArthur said "I hold no branch in higher esteem than the Merchant Marine. They brought us our lifeblood, and paid for it with their own."

General Dwight Eisenhower said, "When final victory is ours, there is no organization that will share it's credit more deservedly than the U.S. Merchant Marine."

Cash reimbursements to Veterans for beneficiary travel will end at PVAMC

The U.S. Treasury Department issued a mandate in 2013 to all federal agencies to reduce or eliminate the use of cash for beneficiary payments. Across the nation, VA medical centers are implementing this mandate as it applies to benef-

iciary travel reimbursement.

Portland VA Medical Center (PVAMC) has spent the past year upgrading business processes and eliminating administrative backlog in preparation for this change which will begin on July 15, 2014.

Similar to VARHS (Roseburg VA) Veterans will be required to submit information for bank routing numbers to have on file to facilitate the transfer of travel pay. For information contact the PVAMC payroll office 503-273-5069 M-F 8-4.

Cemetery Parking Lot Pavers on display




