Tips for Quilters

- Restoring old fabric
1 Quart buttermilk
1 Quart water
2 ounces lemon juice
Let soak for 1 hour or longer (it won't hurt the fabric)
Hand wash, rinse, then dry
- Haven't got a stiletto—Use an orange stick
- To take gunk off an iron—put salt on a brown paper bag. Use a hot iron over the salt on the bag until the gunk is gone.
If you have a Teflon coated iron—use a dryer sheet and iron until gunk is gone.
- Am sure you have an extra mouse pad around. Use one under your foot pedal as a non slip tool.
- When threading a needle—wet the needle NOT the thread. Works well.
- To make that accurate 1/4" seam allowance, place a thin strip of moleskin on the machine OR use a piece of masking tape OR even a Post-It note works well.

These are hints I've pick up over the years. Hope they are useful to you..

CHKD has asked for small comfort quilts for babies that get to go home but don't have the best prognosis. These quilts can be from 24" to 36" in size and you can use brighter, happier fabrics. Use pastel or muted fabrics for these quilts and the size can be 22" to 24" squares. NATASHA House still needs 2 bunk bed quilts approximate size is 60" x 85". How To Increase Your Accuracy

Sewing a precise 1/4" seam is the most important tool a quilter can have. To save time and avoid frustration be sure you are always sewing accurate 1/4" seams. While many machines come with specialty 1/4" feet, these also need to be tried and tested to be sure they are accurate. To test your seam allowance sew and then measure the width of the seam with an acrylic ruler. Another way to do this is to rotary cut three 1 1/2" x 5" strips of fabric. Sew them together with your 1/4" seam. Press the seams open and measure the width of the middle strip from the right side of the fabric. The middle strip should measure exactly 1" wide. If this measurement is not correct, cut new strips and continue to make adjustments until your seams are 1/4". Some machines allow the needle to be moved to the right or the left, and often it's possible to make an adjustment by simply moving the needle.

More Quilting Tips and Tricks

Washing Caution

Avoid using fabric softener in the washer or dryer when you prewash fabrics that you later intend to fuse. Fusible web will not adhere properly to fabrics treated with fabric softener.

Accidents Happen

If you have accidentally fused an appliqué in the wrong place, use a fabric softener dryer sheet as a pressing cloth to loosen the web so you can remove the appliqué to reposition it.

Avoiding Fuzz

When changing thread on your sewing machine, cut the thread at the spool, and pull the thread out toward the needle. This will avoid fuzzing up the tension disks and will actually "floss" the tension mechanism at the same time.

Monofilament Thread

If you are having difficulty seeing clear monofilament thread when threading your needle, run the end of the thread across a permanent marker. This will color only the end of the thread and make it easier to see to thread the needle.

Emery Board

When drawing lines on squares to make Triangle-Squares and Flying Geese units, use an emery board as a straight edge. It won't slip, and keeps the fabric from stretching as you draw.

Pre-wind neutral bobbins

This is an especially helpful idea when attending a class or retreat. Pre-wound bobbins can also be purchased from some thread manufacturers.

Chain piecing

Not only does chain piecing save a lot of time for quilters, but it also helps to save thread. To chain piece, sew a set of fabric pieces together, stopping just before the edge of the fabric pair. Without removing the fabrics from the presser foot, prepare and add another set of fabrics. Begin sewing the next pair without clipping threads.

Maintain your machine

Remember to periodically clear any lint and oil from the bobbin case of your machine. A well-maintained machine is one that will provide years and years of trouble-free sewing. One easy way to regularly take care of this routine maintenance is to clean and oil after you have emptied five bobbins (keep empty bobbins together so you know). For professional maintenance, most manufacturers recommend a regular cleaning once a year.

Free Template Plastic

Use the plastic sheet that comes in bacon packages to make templates and stencils. The frosty side prevents slipping when placed on the fabric.

Handy Gadget Tote

Here's a cute way to keep your gadgets handy when you're on the go. Place six sealable snack bags on a potholder so the bottoms meet in the center. Sew a piece of grosgrain ribbon down the center of potholder, stitching through bags. Fold the potholder and sew a big button on the outside for a closure.

Hanging Helper

When finishing a wall hanging, add a fabric sleeve to the bottom of the back large enough to hold a 1/2"-diameter dowel. This weights down the bottom and helps the sides hang straight.

Handy Bobbin Holder

The little plastic tripod included with a delivered pizza will hold thread and bobbins for storage while you work. Invert the tripod, and put spools or bobbins on the spindles.
