# Today's Sunday School—Lesson 30

# BEFORE YOU SAY 'I DO'

Memory Verse: "Let all things be done decently and in order" 1 Cor. 14v40. Lesson text: Genesis 29v11-20

#### A. The Importance of Courtship

Christian courtship is that period before wedding/marriage when a Christian brother and sister make plans, relate and reach a compromise on so many issues pertaining to their future together. Courtship is very important and necessary for the intending couple to observe during which proper biblical foundation must be laid in order to have a happy married life (1 Thess. 5v21). One vital issue that must be addressed during this period is to obtain the consent of both parents (Gen. 24v54-59)

Courtship is also a period to know each other's views, personalities, temperament, characters intimately in order to forge a lasting relationship. This time of courtship should NOT be used to explore one another sexually or emotionally (1 Cor. 6v18-20; Rom. 12v1-2). You can pray, study the bible or attend Christian programmes but avoid hanging out in secluded and tempting places (2 Cor. 2v11; 1 Thess. 5v22). Know each other's strength and weaknesses, likes and dislikes, parents etc. it is also expedient that you take marriage counselling lessons together during courtship (Prov. 11v14)

### B. Red flags to watch out for

There are a number of "red flags" to look for before entering a permanent marriage relationship. Unfortunately, these indicators may not be visible until after the marriage takes place, since some Christians are 'skilled' at hiding their true nature or change with circumstances.

However, a short list of things to look out for include irrational jealousy, deception, a constant desire to always be in control (dominate the other partner), physical or emotional abuse/violence, a quick (hot) temper, cruelty towards animals, adherence to unscriptual traditional values, attempts to isolate the other person from his or her friends and family, drugs or alcohol abuse, smoking and disrespect for boundaries, privacy, personal space or moral values.

If you see any of these warning signs or strange behaviours in a person you are entering a relationship with, please pray and seek advise from your Spiritual leader, or marriage counsellor before you say 'I DO'. (Mk. 14v38; Prov. 15v22; 19v20). Marriage should not be viewed as a do or die affair. You have a destiny to fulfil (Jer. 29v11). You may consider the saying that 'a broken courtship is better than a broken marriage' and make a wise/informed decision (Eccl. 10v10; 1 Cor. 7v15b)

#### **Conclusion:**

Watch and pray before you say 'I DO'.

# Open Heaven for today

## THE WORD PROSPERS

Memorise: So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the things whereto I sent it. Isaiah 55:11 Read: Isaiah 55:9-13 (KJV)

Through Isaiah 55:11 we understand that the word of God has purpose, direction and the capacity to prosper. I pray that the Almighty will send His word to you today for the purpose of settling all that concerns you in Jesus' Name. Since the word of God has the capacity to prosper, it can therefore activate prosperity in the life of anyone it is working for. Unquestionably, the word of God is very powerful. In fact, God's power is inherent in His word. To understand the power in God's word, **Hebrews 11:3** makes us to understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God. The Holy Spirit also says in **Hebrews 4:12**:

"For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart"

Through this scripture, the Holy Spirit reveals to us that God's word has the power to effect change in the spirit, soul and body of man.

However, in spite of the power that God's word possesses, its capacity to activate prosperity does not work in the life of everyone. For this capacity to be activated, a person must first embrace and revere the word of God. You embrace God's word by believing what it says, and you revere it when you obey what it commands and live by its principles. Unfortunately, many children of God who believe His word and desire to prosper are not prosperous because they refuse to reverse the word. For example, the word-made-flesh said in **Luke 6:38**:

"Give, and it shall be given unto you; good measures, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over, shall men give into your bosom. For with the same measure that ye mete withal it shall be measured to you again."

Only those who believe this word and act on it will prosper by the power embedded in it. it is not the hearer but the doers of God's word that are justified (**Romans 2:13**). Prosperity will stay with them and overtake them all the days of their lives. Here is what the Holy Spirit says in **James 1:25** concerning those who revere the word of God by obeying its commands and living by its principles:

"But whoso looketh into the perfect law of liberty, and continueth therein, he being not a forgetful hearer, but a doer of the work, this man shall be blessed in his deed."

I pray that you will begin to prosper by the word of God from today in Jesus' Name.
